This year, **Maurepas High School** is celebrating the ten year anniversary of the “**French Café**”. The purpose of this charity event is to collect funds to buy Christmas presents for children of less fortunate families in our community.

In 2005, 5th grade students opened the very first French Café (the Wolves Café) of Maurepas School during the Literacy Night. We had 16 student desks set up as four tables for our customers. We were located in the “basement” and we collected \$177.85. Right away, it became a tradition.; and every year, during Literacy Night or Math Night, 5th grade students opened and hosted their café. And every year it grew and grew. Soon we moved it to the school cafeteria, to have more room for our costumers. The “French Café” grew so fast that more people needed to help. Beta Club students, and faculty and staff started to help, donate and volunteer their time to the café. In 2014, the café was big enough to host its own night. Now, the whole school participates in the event, taking part in the program, creating ornaments and pieces of art to sell during the night. Last year, we raised \$2,584.39.

The “French Café” works because of you and your donations. Parents of 5th graders, teachers and friends of the school donate food, drinks and snacks for students to sell. All money raised on the café night will go to the cause.

This year, we are still growing bigger, inviting you to visit our booth on the second floor. Three new booth, “**Raffle for a Gift Basket.**” “**Keychain Souvenir,**” and “**Picture With Santa**” are opening with the “**Silent Auction,**” and the “**An Ornament for a Donation.**” We hope to see you December 3 at Maurepas High School, 23923 Hwy 22, Maurepas, starting at 5:00 PM.

MHS FALL CROSS COUNTRY



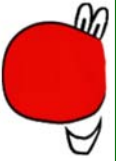
