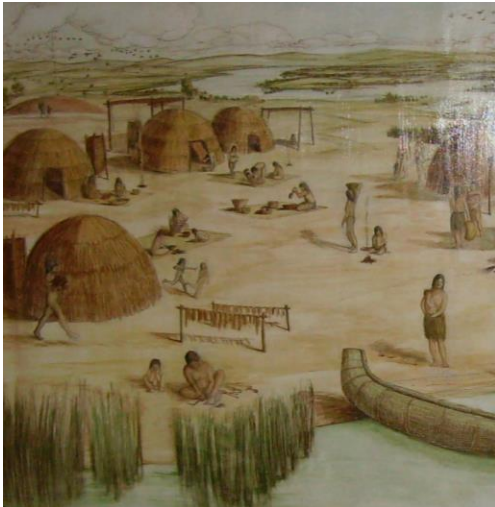


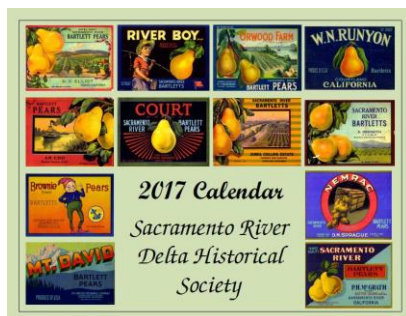
# *Sacramento River Delta Indians*
