From The Pastor's Desk:

One of my favorite pastors, Rev. Barry Galley, taught me to approach the Lenten Season by doing something that was different from what is normally practiced by Christians.

Instead of looking for "something to give up" for Lent, Rev. Galley encouraged us to "add something" during the Lenten Season.

I was always baffled by folks giving up things like desserts, or chocolate, or food from fast -food restaurants, or the myriad of creative ideas that they could find. The idea behind this Lenten "sacrifice" was to help explore a deeper spirituality by bodily denying something that is important in your life. I'm not sure that I found a deeper spirituality in this season because of depriving myself of something I generally was accustomed to having.

There was even one time that I remember I gave up the use of salt on my food for the period of Lent. And I can definitely say that...first of all...I will never do that again. And second...a deeper spirituality was not what I was feeling as I ate food that was very bland to my taste without adding salt.

So, I was quite happy with Rev. Galley's suggestion that, instead of taking something away, try to *add something* during Lent. One year I added one phone call a day to people who could not get out and about to offer an opportunity for conversation. Another Lenten Season I purposely ate in the lunchroom each day at my place of employment, and started conversations with people who had no partners to share the lunch period. There was a year I volunteered to help people who were unable to drive and take them to the doctor or other appointments.

What wonderful experiences these turned out to be for me...and hopefully for the people I had come into contact with during these times. While purposely sharing time and conversations with others, I had the opportunity to learn many new things about them and their lives, and my life was enriched because of those experiences.

We are now in the Season of Lent as we move forward to the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, Easter Sunday, March $31^{\rm st}$. Elsewhere in our newsletter you will find the schedule of mid-week Lenten services, beginning at noon with soup and sandwiches, followed by Lenten worship, and then desserts to close the afternoon. The service on March $13^{\rm th}$ will be held at The Lutheran Church of The Holy Trinity so I hope we will see you there. Holy Week Services of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday are listed on the schedule as well.

I hope you will enter into the Spirit of Lent, and that you will also find a way to "add something" to make your Lenten Season a time of spiritual renewal.

REDNER'S REGISTER TAPES

Did you know that Redner's Warehouse Markets gives 1% of purchases back to the Women of the ELCA? This one percent can really add up! And the monies goes to good things like the Mission Trip, VFW, Berk's Women in Crisis, just to name a few.

In order for Redner's to count the receipt (a.k.a. register tape), it has to be the ENTIRE receipt, and it has to have a "save-a-tape" number on it. How do you insure this? Well, you must use your pump perks card or save-a-tape card at the checkout. Then, just drop the ENTIRE receipt in the box at the ushers station in the narthex. DO NOT cut the bottom off. We only get credit for COMPLETE tapes! Also, please be sure to turn your tapes in in a timely manner, as Redner's will not accept any over three years old.

LCHT MINISTRIES INFORMATION

FOOD PANTRY:

During 2023 the Food Pantry met the needs of families with food insecurity by continuing distributions every 3rd Saturday of each month. Drive thru continues to be the method of distribution. There was a tremendous response to the food pantry's request for nutritious snacks for children. These items were bagged and distributed one for every child within each family in the summer months. Turkeys and Holiday boxes were ordered through Helping Harvest and distributed during November. The Food Pantry purchased hams to be distributed to each family in December. Food donations in 2023 were also received from the Shoemakersville Senior Citizens (twice), SV Middle School and SV High School.

January – 94 families February – 90 families March – 98 families April – 87 families May – 95 families July – 86 families August – 98 families September – 91 families

October – 101 families November – 106 families December – 110 families




LEESPORT AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY ANNUAL SPRING FLOWER SALE
