### TECH TIPS

### **Rear Spring Replacement**

This article was written by Barry Thomas and appeared in the Early Bird of Nov-Dec 1979 and has been somewhat edited and has material added by your editor which was not in the original submission. It is the third of a series by Barry

Tail end draggin? Headlights pointing at the trees?

Seriously, if your rear springs are straight or curve down rather than up, and the ride goes to h\*\*I when there is only your wipe rag in the trunk, you need rear springs.

Overload shocks with coil springs will restore the correct height but not the ride. New springs can be purchased from the TBird suppliers or a well equipped local spring shop. (Note – the 55's springs differ from 56/57's). Springs can be rearched, but may not last as long as new ones. The parts that wear are as follows:

5741-Insulators, two per spring

5780-Bolt – front of spring

5781-Bushing, front and rear

5630-Shackles

It might be wise to replace the U bolts & nuts Always replace both springs to keep things level.

A few days before you start the job, soak the U bolt nuts, the forward spring nuts and bolts and the rear shackle nuts with a good penetrating oil such as PB Blaster. The more you put on over a period of days the easier it will be to remove the nuts.

No special tools are needed, but patience is.

- 1. Jack up the rear of the Bird, placing blocks or stands under the frame directly in front of the forward spring perch.
- 2. Remove the wheel and tire assemblies
- 3. Unfasten the lower end of the shock absorber.
- 4. Remove the U Blot nuts attaching the rear end housing to the spring. If you can't remove them by unscrewing or they snap the U Blot, the new U Bolts recommended will come in handy.
- 5. Lift the rear end assembly an inch or two off the spring and support it on a block or stands.
- 6. Remove the rear shackle nuts and the outer half of the shackle.
- 7. Slip the spring off the shackle and lower it to the ground. If there is a lot of rust between the spring and the rubber insulator this can be a chore. If you encounter a problem like this, it may be better to use a heavy hammer and drive the shackle out. (Continued on page 7)

### **CTCI Int'l Convention**

#### **Tech Tips (Continued)**

- 8. Remove the nut from the forward spring pivot bolt (5780) and slide the bolt out of the spring eye and frame. The spring is now out. This sounds easy-sometimes it is-most of the time it isn't. Many times the bolt will seize in the frame or the spring eve bushing due to rust or wear. Since it is impossible to get a straight shot at the end of the bolt due to some designers' non-ability to foresee maintenance problems, this is the point where vou need the patience mentioned earlier. Try all available hammers. Penetrating oils usually will not work its way in despite repeated applications. Don't use heat because of the gas line in the area. I've had luck with cutting the bolt on both sides of the spring between the hanger and the spring and the spring and the spring with a saw. Then drive the remaining portion of the bolt out of the frame with a drift and hammer. I've also had luck with a foot long 1: diameter steel bar held on the end of the bolt by a trusting helper and whacking the other end of the bar with a sledge hammer.
- 9. Make sure the bushings are installed in the new spring then position the forward eye of the new spring in its hanger and slip in the new WELL LUBRICATED bolt. Install and tighten its nut.
- 10. Install the new rear shackle bushings in the rear of the spring, slide the spring on to the shackle, install the outer plate and assemble and tighten the two nuts.
- 11. Position the rear end housing on the spring being certain that the mounting plates and rubbers (5741) are installed in the proper order and the housing is located on the positioning pin head. If you don't locate the housing correctly, the car will "crab" as you drive.
- 12. Reassemble the U Bolts over the rear end housing and through the lower shock mount plate. Make sure the plate is in the correct position for the shock . Install and torque (70 ftlbs) the nuts.
- 13. Reattach the bottom of the shock absorber to the plate (replace if necessary).
- 14. Replace the wheel
- 15. Do the other side in the same manner. Suspension work on TBirds, like any other car, is dirty and often time consuming but is easily accomplished.
