On May 19, 2014 at 0830 hrs. in the Office of the Chief of Police, Colonel Stephen Lynch assigned me to investigate the conduct and actions taken by Patrolman [REDACTED] during his interaction with [REDACTED] age 11, at approximately 1856 hrs on May 11, 2014 while inside the Burrillville Police station.

Knowledge of the incident in question became apparent on May 16, 2014 at 1422 hrs. [REDACTED] sent an email to Patrol Commande [REDACTED] regarding a call he received from [REDACTED] an employee at [REDACTED] the Supervising Provider of the [REDACTED] Di [REDACTED] related a family from Burrillville responded to Hasbro to report a child on child sexual assault. Dr [REDACTED] informed Sgt. Riendeau that the mother, [REDACTED] stated on or shortly after mother's day she and her daughter, [REDACTED] age 11, reported to the Burrillville Police Department regarding this issue and at the time, the mother doubted the child's disclosure. The mother and child reported to Dr [REDACTED] that during the meeting with an officer (whose name she could not recall) the child was taken into one of the cells and advised if she didn't tell the truth, she would go to jail. Dr. [REDACTED] said that the child had made full disclosure of sex assault by her brother. Dr. [REDACTED] also advised the circumstances presented itself to the point she and/or the State of RI (DCYF), took custody of [REDACTED]

On May 16, 2014 @ 1400 hours, Sgt Riendeau contacted Det. Cahill via phone and confirmed that the mother and child did report to the Burrillville Police Station on May 11th. The day sheet entry and only documentation about the complaint indicates the child was there for a disciplinary issue. Sgt. Riendeau instructed Det. Cahill to follow up with Dr. [REDACTED]; to obtain any and all information and to generate a report regarding the matter. The information was forwarded to Colonel Lynch.

On May 19, 2014 Colonel Lynch, Detective Sgt. Riendeau, Detective Cahill and I reviewed the video recording of the interview Officer [REDACTED] had with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] biological father [REDACTED]. After viewing the video, I issued Office [REDACTED] memo requesting him to explain his actions during his interaction with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and compelled him to provide me with a written statement. I then obtained the following information/documents:

- RI State Police transcription of [REDACTED] interview video
- Child Protective Report from Dr. [REDACTED]
- Statement from on duty Dispatcher [REDACTED]
- Statement from on duty supervisor [REDACTED]
- Copy of video of interview with Office [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]
- Copy of report # 20032892 authored by [REDACTED] case worker RI DCYF
- Copy of Providence Police report 2014-00044789 - disturbance at RI Hospital ER on 5/15/2014

On June 6, 2014 after collecting and reviewing the above information, Detective Sergeant Riendeau and I interviewed [REDACTED] in the interview room of the Burrillville Police station. The interview was recorded and a copy along with a transcript is attached to this investigative package. Also on June 6th at 1845 hrs. I called [REDACTED] the biological father of [REDACTED] to finalize the time for his interview. [REDACTED] complained that he had to work and couldn't take time away to come to Burrillville. I then told him I would call him back. At 1849, I called [REDACTED] back on a recorded line and asked him if he would mind answering a few questions over the phone to which he agreed. A copy of that recording is attached to this investigation package.

The following is a summary of the facts and activity which took place between [REDACTED] and Officer [REDACTED]

On May 11, 2014, [redacted] brought their daughter, [redacted] to the Burrillville Police station. [redacted] advised Dispatcher [redacted] that they wanted to speak with an officer regarding a disciplinary issue with her daughter. Dispatcher [redacted] entered the subject's request for assistance into the daily log. Officer [redacted] was in the station at that time, so Dispatcher [redacted] issued the complaint along with the initial information to Officer [redacted].

Statement by [redacted] summary):

Officer [redacted] stated the following in his written statement. [redacted] explained to him that her daughter [redacted] has been disobedient and lying lately. When he asked [redacted] why she was acting this way [redacted] said she was "stressed out." Officer [redacted] then stated he had her name some things that made her feel this way. At which point he remembers [redacted] interrupted and said to [redacted] to tell the officer what she told her, about what her 8 year old brother did to her. [redacted] then told [redacted] that two sexual things were done to her by her brother. [redacted] does not explain what those two things were in his statement but he did say that he was shocked to hear an 11 year old girl say this. [redacted] then goes on to say that [redacted] said that "what she just said was not true and that she said those things because she wanted a new bike".

[redacted] told Officer [redacted] about 3 years ago there was a problem involving [redacted] and the Woonsocket Police and the [redacted] was checked by a doctor. Again Officer [redacted] was not explicit or forthcoming on the incident as to what happened or who was involved, but he did state he thought it was odd that [redacted] who would have been around 8 years old at that time, was speaking of sexual things. [redacted] then suggested to [redacted] that they go to a doctor and get referred to a counselor.

Officer [redacted] in his statement states that he was asked by [redacted] if he could put [redacted] into the juvenile cell. He advised he did not like to do this with kids because he didn't want them to hate the police when they grow up. He then stated that [redacted] said she would explain that mommy put her in the cell not the policeman which she did after letting [redacted] out of the cell. [redacted] said he did this (put [redacted] in the juvenile cell) to have a chance to speak with both parents with [redacted] out of the room.

[redacted] continues to state that once he and the parents were alone they discussed that [redacted] was not telling the truth and that whenever [redacted] and her brother were together they were not out of the parents sight. They concluded that they would take [redacted] to the doctor the following day. Officer [redacted] then said both parents thanked him and they went to get [redacted] out of the cell and left the building.

Officer [redacted] states the reason he did not produce a written report on this complaint because he did not believe there was evidence of any sexual assault. [redacted] then states that if there was an assault we would be advised by a medical professional from her checkup the next day. [redacted] states that looking back, I should have completed a short report on the visit. I would have then forwarded it to Detectives and then follow up on the doctor's visit. He states that he has little experience with sexual assault cases.

Statement by Dispatcher [redacted] summary):

Dispatcher [redacted] was the on duty dispatcher May 11, 2014. Dispatcher [redacted] states that at 1856 hrs. [redacted] entered the station with a male subject believed to be her husband and juvenile daughter. [redacted] requested to speak with an officer regarding a disciplinary problem with her child. Officer [redacted] who was in the station was advised of the walk-in and the nature of the call. Officer [redacted] entered the lobby and spoke with the subjects and he then escorted them into the conference room.

Dispatcher [redacted] states that after a short time later, the juvenile female was placed into the juvenile cell for reasons not known to him nor was he advised. [redacted] did monitor the cell as he would under normal conditions, both audio and video were active. [redacted] said the juvenile was at times loud and unruly. Officer [redacted] returned to the conference room with the [redacted] subjects. [redacted] then ran data on [redacted] since that was the only information he had at this point.

The juvenile remained in the cell until he could hear [redacted] in the corridor speaking with the juvenile through the locked cell door. Dispatcher [redacted] then heard [redacted] ask the juvenile if she was willing to cooperate and behave which the child answered to the affirmative. Shortly thereafter Officer [redacted] let the child out of the cell and reunited her with her parents. The parties then left the station thanking Dispatcher [redacted] through the window. Dispatcher [redacted] closed his statement saying that Officer [redacted] left without requesting any data or any incident number. Officer [redacted] told [redacted] that the juvenile was placed in the cell as a "scare tactic".

NAR FIVE FOR MAJOR LARETO P GUGLIET

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Statement by Sergeant (summary):

Sergeant [redacted] was the Shift Commander on May 11, 2014 from 1600 hrs to 0000 hrs. [redacted] relates the following: Sgt. [redacted] was not notified of the situation until later in the evening of May 11th. Ofc. [redacted] told him that he spoke with a juvenile who was brought in by her parents. He stated he spoke with the juvenile and left it at the [redacted] stated at no time was he advised or had knowledge that Ofc. [redacted] put anyone in the juvenile cell nor was he advised of any possible sexual molestation or sexual assault.

INVESTIGATION:

Throughout this investigation this officer reviewed video and audio recordings and transcripts of :

Initial interview conducted by Officer [redacted] /11/2014
 Juvenile cell video of [redacted] 5/11/2014
 Follow up interview of [redacted] by Major Guglietta and Det. [redacted] 6/06/2014
 Follow up phone interview with A. [redacted] 6/06/2014 by M. [redacted]

During the initial interview by Officer [redacted] he brought [redacted] and [redacted] into the interview room. Officer [redacted] asked questions trying to ascertain the [redacted] brought [redacted] to the police station. During the interview Officer [redacted] lead the interview making accusations and statements to which [redacted] had short one or two word answers. Within the first few minutes, Officer [redacted] asks [redacted] why she is frustrated and then says to "give me two (reasons)". [redacted] immediately states "my brother did something to me". Instead of coaxing more information from [redacted] about what her brother did to her, Officer [redacted] states "Don't blame other people for why you're here. My kid tries that all the time."

The interview continues with Office [redacted] [redacted] to admit what she did wrong to get her in trouble with her parents. [redacted] admits to hitting her brother. Officer [redacted] tells her she can be arrested for that and then says "Do you want to see where you can end up?" [redacted] says, "no". Officer [redacted] [redacted] what she committed a Domestic Assault at which time [redacted] states, "I don't want to go to jail." Officer [redacted] continued by saying "Well I'm going to show you before you leave so that the next time you go to hit somebody you think about that cell I showed you. So before you leave, you're going to see where you can end up." This is the first time during this interview that the cell is brought up and it is brought up by Office [redacted] which contradicts what he stated in his written statement.

[redacted] then tell [redacted] to tell the nice police officer what you told me this morning when mommy went to the store about 11:30 -12 o'clock today. Agar [redacted] stated "my brother did something. He told me he was going to kiss me on my private area and my bum". [redacted] began to explain what [redacted] was trying to say "that her brother (8 year old [redacted]) had touched her in her private areas, okay, her butt and her private, and he rubbed his - I don't know how to say it against her butt". Officer [redacted] later asks where is she hearing stuff like this? Where is she picking up this type of talk? The discussion then went into different areas again away from the discussion of [redacted] being touched sexually by her brother.

After further discussion with [redacted] and [redacted] Office [redacted] says to [redacted], "Why don't you go sit there now while me and mommy and dad talk. C'mon." Office [redacted] then had [redacted] follow him out of the interview room and walked with her to the juvenile cell. Office [redacted] then showed her how he treats prisoners. He had [redacted] remove her shoes and bracelets and placed the bracelets in her shoes and then told her to enter the cell. Office [redacted] then closed the door and locked it [redacted] became hysterical, she started screaming and crying. [redacted] kept looking out the cell window and banged on the door for someone to let her out. At this time the video in the juvenile cell shows movement away from the cell hallway and immediately thereafter you see Office [redacted] re-enter the interview room. Officer [redacted] states, "we're all set. Let her stay in there and let her see what it's like for a minute. You guys wanted her there, so." The juvenile cell video then shows [redacted] pacing inside the cell and banging on the door [redacted] was left in the juvenile cell for twelve minutes and six seconds.

Prior to opening the cell door Officer [redacted] said to [redacted], "Now, she might go home and be a bigger pain tonight now because of what we just did to her by doing this, you know. I don't like being the scare police, but you asked me. Because I don't want her to be afraid of me in the future when she needs me." "Make sure when we take her out that mommy had you put in there so you get a taste of it." As Officer [redacted] and the parents stood outside the cell door while [redacted] cried, [redacted] states, "Ok, Ok, Ok, that's it, this officer didn't put you in there, I put you in there."

Office [redacted] gave [redacted] a lecture, stating, "You don't do nothing in these places until we tell you; you sit and you go to sleep when we tell you; we make you get up when we want you to. You have no control of your life in a place like this and you have no visitors."

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then asks to go to the bathroom and Officer [REDACTED] asks, "How do you like it when people tell you you can't go to the bathroom?" [REDACTED] said "okay". After more discussion [REDACTED] was released from the cell by Officer [REDACTED]. They returned to the interview room and after she got her keys [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] exited the building.

Officer [REDACTED] did not provide any further information to the dispatcher on this incident and he did not document any of the information discussed in the interview. Although the fact that [REDACTED] made mention on numerous occasions during the interview that she was touched and touched in a sexual manner by her brother [REDACTED]. Officer [REDACTED] never stopped the interview, contacted his supervisor or made an attempt to get advice or assistance with the evidence put before him.

On June 6, 2014 Detective [REDACTED] and I interviewed [REDACTED]. During the Q & A she discussed [REDACTED] history and gave information that [REDACTED] was sexually assaulted by her younger brother as far back as two years ago in Woonsocket. This information has been passed onto the Woonsocket Police Department and the RI DCYF.

On Monday May 11, 2015 I was assigned by Colonel Stephen J. Lynch, Chief of Police, to conduct an Internal Affairs investigation of Officer [REDACTED]. The complaint that generated the investigation was filed on May 9, 2015 by a [REDACTED], age 44, [REDACTED] Ms. [REDACTED] alleged that during an arrest made on May 7, 2015 Officer [REDACTED] used excessive force, was rude, did not secure her in his cruiser with a seat belt and did not listen to her complaint.

HISTORY

On Thursday May 7, 2015 at approximately 9:35 P.M., Officer [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] residence for a reported domestic dispute. Upon arrival they interviewed Ms. [REDACTED] and her daughter, [REDACTED] age 21. Both parties agreed that a verbal argument had taken place while they were in the car driving home. Ms. [REDACTED] alleged that her mother punched her in the mouth twice. Ms. [REDACTED] alleged that her daughter had punched her in the arm. Ms. [REDACTED] was determined to be the primary aggressor and taken into custody.

INVESTIGATION

On Monday May 18, 2015 I met with [REDACTED] to conduct an interview with [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] told me that she had gone to pick up her daughter from work, and that an argument ensued while they were driving home. She said that during this argument she "lightly hit" her daughter twice. She also told me that her daughter then punched her in the arm. Ms. [REDACTED] went on to say that she was upset for several reasons. She felt that since both she and her daughter struck each other that they both should have been arrested. She also maintained that while being placed in handcuffs, Officer [REDACTED] put the cuffs on too tight and as a result suffered injuries to her wrists. Ms. [REDACTED] went on to say that once placed in the cruiser at her residence she was made to sit in the back "for over half an hour". She stated that she was left in the back of the cruiser a second time once at police headquarters for a "bit longer". She also told me that she is under a doctor's care for a back injury.

I explained to Ms. [REDACTED] that as police officers, we're trained to determine a "predominant aggressor" when we investigate domestic situations, and that was what Officer [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] did. She countered by saying that she never spoke with Sgt. [REDACTED] and that "he was never in the house". She told me that Officer [REDACTED] made the determination to arrest her by himself.

I next asked her if she had any medical documentation to corroborate her allegation that she suffered the injuries that she said she did. She provided a discharge sheet from the North Smithfield Urgent Care dated May 9. I asked her if she was receiving any follow up care, to which she said that she was. Ms. [REDACTED] has not to date provided any documentation to support this.

[REDACTED] also made a statement indicating that she was once a detective in this department. I asked her what she meant by that and she said "I used to be a detective in this town". I told her that to my knowledge she was never a member of the police department at which point she retracted the statement.

On Tuesday May 19, 2015 I received a statement from Officer [REDACTED] regarding his participation in this arrest. He stated that he and Sergeant [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] and spoke with both Ms. [REDACTED] and her daughter. He observed an injury to Ms. [REDACTED] that was consistent with being struck in the mouth as she alleged. He said that he also saw a small bruise on Ms. [REDACTED]'s arm consistent with being struck [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that after consulting with Sgt. [REDACTED] they determined that Ms. [REDACTED] was the primary aggressor, subsequently placing her under arrest.

He went on to say that while placing her in handcuffs, he made sure that the cuffs were placed on her

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properly, using his finger as a gap to insure a proper fit. He stated that he then double locked the cuffs. Officer [REDACTED] said that at no time did Ms. [REDACTED] complain that the handcuffs were too tight.

On Friday May 22, 2015 I received a written statement from Sgt. [REDACTED] regarding this incident. He said that he and Officer [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] for a reported domestic dispute. Upon their arrival, they spoke with [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] explained the altercation to them, at which point Sgt. [REDACTED] had a rescue respond to check [REDACTED]. He said that when they had concluded their conversation with [REDACTED] they entered the house to speak with Ms. [REDACTED].

He said that Ms. [REDACTED] admitted to striking her daughter causing the lip injury. Sgt. [REDACTED] said that Ms. [REDACTED] seemed to be down playing the incident by emphasizing that she "lightly hit" [REDACTED]. He said that he and Officer [REDACTED] concurred that Ms. [REDACTED] was the primary aggressor and placed her under arrest.

Sgt. [REDACTED] said that Ms. [REDACTED] then began pleading with them not to be arrested, saying that she knew several State Troopers. He said that she was informed that irrespective of her association with any one else in law enforcement she was under arrest for a domestic assault.

Sgt. [REDACTED] said in his statement that he observed Officer [REDACTED] handcuff Ms. [REDACTED] and that he followed proper handcuffing procedures. He also said that Officer [REDACTED] acted in a professional and courteous manner, which he does with every prisoner.

On Wednesday May 27, 2015 I received a written statement from Officer [REDACTED]. She said that her conversation with Ms. [REDACTED] was limited to Ms. [REDACTED] stating that she did not know why she had been arrested with Officer [REDACTED] responding that she was not on scene.

With regards to Ms. [REDACTED] assertion that she was kept handcuffed in the back of Officer [REDACTED] cruiser for over half an hour, thereby exacerbating her back condition, the day log for that day shows that Officer [REDACTED] reported having her in custody at 2200 hours. It goes on to reflect that he began his transport of her at 2210 hours and arrived at the station at 2216 hours. She was then secured in a cell at 2218 hours. This is a total of 18 minutes.

SUMMARY

As stated in the introduction [REDACTED] is alleging that Officer [REDACTED] used excessive force when taking her into custody as a result of a domestic assault, that he was rude to her and that he would not listen to her complaint. The report completed by Officer [REDACTED] as well as the statement provided by he and Sergeant [REDACTED] shows that Officer [REDACTED] employed proper handcuffing techniques and acted in a highly professional and forthright manner when dealing with her. Furthermore the departments day log from the date of the incident clearly refutes any suggestion that Ms. [REDACTED] was detained in a police cruiser for an excessive amount of time.

With regards to Officer [REDACTED] not listening to her complaint, again the report generated as well as the witness statements show that both Ms. [REDACTED] and Ms. [REDACTED] agreed on the circumstances surrounding the situation. After having listened to both parties a determination was made by both Officer [REDACTED] and Sergeant [REDACTED] that Ms. [REDACTED] was the predominant aggressor and appropriately arrested.

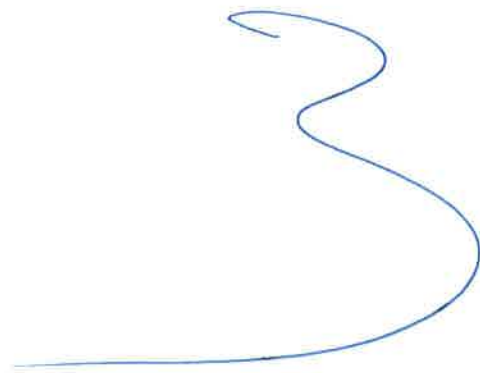
RECOMMENDATION

On Monday May 18, 2015 I was assigned by Colonel Stephen Lynch, Chief of Police, to conduct an Internal Affairs Investigation of Officer [redacted] Sergeant [redacted] id [redacted]. The complaint that generated the investigation was filed on Sunday May 17, 2015 by [redacted] age 43, [redacted] regarding the arrest of her son, [redacted] maintains that during the arrest, Officer [redacted] and [redacted] were rude, denied her son medical attention and ignored a call that she placed through 911 to request a rescue.

History

On Friday May 15, 2015 Officer [redacted] maintaining a stationary traffic post on Wallum Lake Rd. While on this post he observed a subject riding a Yamaha dirt bike towards him at a high rate of speed. The radar unit in his patrol vehicle had been properly calibrated and was in good working order. Officer [redacted] stated that the posted speed in that area is 40 mph and that the radar unit showed the speed of the dirt bike to be 52 mph.

Officer [redacted] id that he attempted to stop the vehicle, however the operator, [redacted] did not stop until he reached his residence at [redacted] St. Once Mr. [redacted] stopped, Officer [redacted] informed him that he was under arrest for eluding a police officer.

While taking Mr. [redacted] into his custody, his mother (the complainant) exited the residence and inquired as to why her son was being arrested. Officer [redacted] advised her that it was for eluding a police officer. Mr. [redacted] then informed his mother that he injured his ankle while riding on the trails. Mrs. [redacted] asked for a rescue to be called to treat her son's injury, however that request was denied by Officer [redacted] consulting with [redacted]. [redacted] then made a 911 call to police headquarters requesting that a rescue respond. [redacted] arrived on scene and the decision was made to transport [redacted] to police headquarters where medical attention would be afforded if so desired by him.

[redacted] was subsequently transported to police headquarters where he was processed and released on a summons for eluding a police officer as well as several motor vehicle charges.

Investigation

On Monday May 18, 2015 at approximately 6:40 P.M. I met with [redacted] police headquarters for the purpose of taking a statement with regards to this incident.

[redacted] told me that on May 15, 2015 sometime between 7:30 and 8:00 P.M. he was riding his dirt bike on the trails between Staghead Drive and Jackson School House Road, when he came upon two women riding horses. He said that he attempted to stop the bike so as not to hit them and as a result lost control of it. He said that his right foot got caught in the peg of the bike injuring it. He said that both women got off their horses to check on his well being, with one of them offering to call her husband to assist [redacted] in getting home. He stated that he told them that he was "ok, and could ride my bike back" [redacted] went on to say that once he felt that he could ride the bike again, he got back on it and began to ride back home. He continued by saying that while traveling on Wallum Lake Road he saw a police officer on the side of the road. He said that he thought he was doing the speed limit, however admitted that he has neither a speedometer or tachometer on his bike. He stated that he continued down Wallum Lake Road, turned onto [redacted] where he stopped in front of his house. He said that as soon as he did so, Officer [redacted] approached him and placed him under arrest.

I asked [redacted] if he recognized Officer [redacted] and he said that he did. I asked him what happened after he was told that he was under arrest and he said that he argued with Officer [redacted] stating "if I was evading that you would have never caught me". I asked [redacted] anyone else was present at this time and he

said that his parents were. I asked him if he had any conversation with them and he said that he told them that he hurt his foot. He also said that there was no conversation about how he hurt his foot. I asked him why this was and he said that his parents already knew how that happened. I asked him how they knew and he said "every time I ride it I get hurt". I then asked him that his mom asked him if he needed to go to the hospital. He told me that he said that he did but was not going in a rescue. I asked him what his mom's response to that was. He said that he did not know as he was in the back of Officer [redacted]'s cruiser, but that he reiterated that he was not going in the back of a rescue.

I next asked [redacted] if he had any conversation with Officer [redacted] about getting medical attention. He said that Officer [redacted] asked him if he wanted a rescue and he said that he did not. I asked him if he had any conversation with Officer [redacted] on the way to police headquarters. [redacted] said that he asked Officer [redacted] how his wife was as they used to work together. He said that "I was pretty much just bullshitting with him" on the way to the station.

I asked [redacted] if he had any conversation with Officer [redacted] once at police headquarters. He said that while in the cell, Officer [redacted] asked him again if he wanted medical attention. [redacted] told me that he asked Officer [redacted] how long it would take to get out of the station if a rescue were called. He said that he wanted to get out of headquarters as soon as possible because he had to be at work at 3:00 the next morning. When told that having a rescue respond would prolong the process he again refused medical treatment as his primary concern was getting out of the station as he had "stuff to do".

Lastly I asked him if he had anything else to add. He told me that at one point while he was in the cell Sgt. [redacted] came in inquiring about his foot. He said that he told the Sergeant that his foot hurt and would like a rescue. The Sergeant told him that he would be out in approximately a half an hour, consequently he said that he changed his mind and did not want a rescue.

On May 18, 2015 I received a written statement from Officer [redacted]. Officer [redacted] indicated in his statement that he was maintaining a stationary traffic post on Wallum Lake Road at approximately 7:45 P.M. He said that he observed a dirt bike approaching his location and that his radar unit indicated a speed of 52 mph in a posted 40 mph zone. Officer [redacted] stated that he attempted to stop this vehicle and while doing so had his emergency lights and siren activated. He also said that at one point while attempting to stop the bike the operator turned around and looked at him. Officer [redacted] statement indicated that the operator of the bike, [redacted] finally stopped in front of his residence at [redacted] St. at which point he was placed under arrest.

While taking McCutcheon into custody Officer [redacted] stated that [redacted] mother, [redacted] came out of the house and inquired as to why her son was being arrested. Officer [redacted] informed her of what had taken place, which he states was ignored by [redacted]. He said that upon learning from her son that he had injured his foot, she demanded that a rescue be called. Officer [redacted] stated that he informed her that [redacted] would receive medical attention, if warranted, once he was at police headquarters. He went on to say that he asked [redacted] if he wanted a rescue, to which he replied "nah, I'm good". Finally, once back at police headquarters he asked [redacted] several times if he wanted a rescue and that [redacted] declined each time.

On Thursday May 21, 2015 I received a statement from [redacted] regarding his participation in this arrest. [redacted] said that On May 15 at approximately 7:45 P.M. he heard over the radio that Officer [redacted] was attempting to stop a dirt bike on Wallum Lake Rd. and that while transmitting he could hear Officer [redacted] siren activated.

[redacted] indicated in his statement that upon his arrival at [redacted] St. he saw [redacted] seated in the rear of Officer [redacted] patrol car, with [redacted] standing in the roadway. He said that she was

very upset and was demanding that a rescue be called for her son. Sergeant [redacted] stated that he consulted with Officer [redacted] and was informed that [redacted] was asked if he required medical attention and that he declined. He said that he spoke with [redacted] and that she reiterated her demand for a rescue. He informed her that a rescue would be called if requested by [redacted] once he was police headquarters. Sergeant [redacted] said that [redacted]'s concern was monetary as she said that she would have to pay for services for a rescue from another district. He said that [redacted] was becoming increasingly irate and that he finally had to advise her that if she did not calm down that she could be arrested for being a disorderly person.

Once back at the station, [redacted] said that he was informed by Officer [redacted] that [redacted] had again been asked if he wanted a rescue and again had declined. He said that he spoke with [redacted] in the cell at which time he explained how he injured his foot. Sergeant [redacted] indicated that he asked [redacted] if he wanted medical attention and that he declined.

On Tuesday May 26, 2015 I received a statement from Officer [redacted] with regards to this incident. Officer [redacted] stated that he assisted Officer [redacted] securing and processing [redacted] police headquarters. He said that he observed that [redacted] had a leg injury, yet when asked if he wanted a rescue he declined. Officer [redacted] said that [redacted]'s main concern seemed to be getting out of police headquarters as soon as possible as he had to be at work early in the morning.

On Tuesday May 26, 2015 I received a statement from [redacted] [redacted] stated that he received a 911 call from [redacted] from a female requesting that a rescue be sent to "where Officer [redacted] is arresting my son". He said that he contacted Office [redacted] via radio and asked if a rescue was needed at his location. He was advised to stand by at which point [redacted] called out on scene. [redacted] indicated in his statement that subsequent to [redacted] arriving at the station, [redacted] entered police headquarters and that she was visibly upset. He said that she told him that she wanted her son seen by a "medical professional". [redacted] indicated that since her son was over 18 years of age, he was not at liberty to speak with her and that an officer would do so as soon as possible.

[redacted] also said that while monitoring the cell via audio and visual he could hear the officers offer [redacted] medical attention and that he declined.

SUMMARY

As stated in the introduction, [redacted] alleges three things in her complaint, that [redacted] and Patrolman [redacted] were rude, that they denied her son medical attention and that [redacted] ignored a 911 call. The interview with all the officers involved seemed to refute those allegations. More importantly however, so does the interview with her son, [redacted] admits in his interview that he was offered medical attention several times and declines each time. Mr. [redacted] also states in his interview that not only wasn't his interaction with Officer [redacted] adversarial, it was personnel in nature.

With regard to the 911 call, once [redacted] received the call he contacted Office [redacted] to verify the need for a rescue. [redacted] never received a reply from Officer [redacted]; therefore never dispatched a rescue. Office [redacted] did not verify the need for a rescue due to [redacted] declining the offer for one.

RECOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that this complaint be considered unfounded as the statements of all the parties involved do not support the allegations.

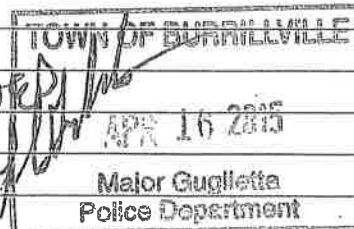

I contacted _____ and advised him of the updated information and requested he and/or Ofc _____ respond to South Main Street and attempt to locate the vehicle.

At the approximate time of 1245 hours, _____ contacted me via phone and advised he had stopped _____ vehicle on South Main Street. He stated the persons are not cooperative and he cannot secure a narotic detection dog for a search. I requested the three transported to the Burrillville Police Station for further investigation and to be monitored by an officer until we can ascertain who is holding the drugs.

I first spoke with _____ who was seated in the conference room _____ stated he was on probation and did not want to get in trouble. He stated during the car stop he observed _____ in possession of "the bag" and place the bag down his pants. As _____ stated this, he demonstrated by putting his hand down to his pants. I asked _____ how _____ got the bag? He replied, _____

_____ and spoke with _____ who appeared nervous. I advised _____ of the information _____ provided and that he was going to be searched accordingly. I advised him it would be in his best interest to cooperate. _____ started to cry, stood up and unfastened the front button of his pants. He reached into the back of his pants towards the buttock area and removed a clear plastic baggie containing a white powdery substance.

When requested to wash his hands, [redacted] stated during the stop, [redacted] was panicking and threw the bag onto his lap. He said he placed the bag down into his pants in an attempt to hide it.

On March 28, 2015 @ 1416 hours, Ofc [redacted] and I interviewed [redacted]. In a recorded interview [redacted] was advised of his Miranda Warnings and requested to talk to police. He did not request to speak with an attorney before, during or after questioning.

In brief, [redacted] stated he [redacted] and his brother [redacted] went to Attleboro MA, near the Emerald Mall, and purchased a bag of heroin for \$60.00. He stated they went to the CVS in Chepachet so [redacted] could sell a pair of glasses.

He stated on the way back into town they were on South Main Street, at which time they were stopped by police. He stated he was holding the bag of heroin in his hand and panicked. He stated he threw the bag onto [redacted] lap.

On March 28, 2015 @ 1440 hours, Ofc [redacted] and I interviewed [redacted]. In a recorded interview he was advised of his Miranda Warnings. He stated he drove [redacted] to the CVS in Chepachet so [redacted] could sell a pair of glasses for \$40.00.

He stated on the way back into town they were stopped on South Main Street, at which time [redacted] threw a bag of "dope" in his lap. He stated he placed the bag down his pants. [redacted] would not admit to driving to Attleboro to purchase the heroin, but did say he and [redacted] used earlier in the day.

On March 28, 2015 @ the approximate time of 1510 hours, [redacted] photographed and the evidence was weighed .7 grams. I conducted a field test of a small sample. I used a factory manufactured NIK test kit, which displayed a positive indication for heroin.

[redacted] will be charged with possession of heroin, and [redacted] will be charged with possession of heroin, driving in possession and property damage. I was later advised that [redacted] who was secured in Cell#1, had damaged the housing to the camera.

SUBJECT: Internal Affairs Complaint Received April 7, 2015

COMPLAINANT:

COMPLAINT: The complainant files a complaint regarding the language and threats made to him by Detective [redacted] stemming from a car stop and subsequent investigation back at police headquarters regarding his being in possession of Heroin. Also alleges that his vehicle and his person were searched without permission once stopped on South Main Street and that he was brought to the Police station for without his permission.

INVESTIGATION: [redacted] had received information from a reliable confidential informant that [redacted] and [redacted] would be returning to Burrillville after having just purchased heroin via Chepachet into town with [redacted] operating a red colored Honda motor vehicle. [redacted] stopped said vehicle with these occupants returning to Burrillville from the Chepachet area at a time consistent with the information received. The vehicle and the three occupants were returned to the police station for further investigation at the direction of [redacted]. At the station questioning of [redacted] and [redacted] corroborated the information received and further that [redacted] was in possession of Heroin who had secreted it on his person at the time of the stop and approaching officers. [redacted] nervousness was also evident to both [redacted] and [redacted] at the Police station. Once confronted with the information that [redacted] was suspected of having heroin on his person [redacted] willingly started to cry and retrieved the heroin contained within a clear plastic bag from inside his pants. [redacted] was charged with Felony Possession of Heroin. [redacted] had made incriminating statements that he had possessed the heroin just prior to the stop being affected and tossed the Heroin to [redacted] to conceal same which he did. [redacted] was also charged with Possession of Heroin.

FINDINGS:

[redacted] was stopped in a motor vehicle that he was operating on March 28th, 2015 as a result of reliable informant information received by Sgt. [redacted], who is responsible for Narcotics Trafficking matters within the Burrillville Police department. The information was further corroborated once the vehicle was stopped, consistent with who was in the vehicle and route of travel and timing of narcotics trafficking incident involved. Information received from both [redacted] and [redacted] at the further corroborated the information and spoke to [redacted] directly being in possession of the suspect Heroin. [redacted] fully admits to using street language in this Narcotics Trafficking investigation and at no time physically touched [redacted] or threatened to touch him. The complainant produced the Heroin from his pants and turned same over to Sgt. [redacted] without incident. Both subjects were charged with Felony counts of Possession of Heroin. The allegations against both Sergeant [redacted] and Sergeant [redacted] are found to be without merit and unfounded.

On 11/10/2014 I was assigned an investigation to substantiate accusations made by [redacted] against officers of the Burrillville Police Department for the treatment of her son [redacted] after he was arrested for assault on October 17, 2014. This allegation was brought to the attention of Lieutenant Dennis Leahey during conversation with [redacted] on 11/06/2014.

[redacted] had a voicemail forwarded to her phone from her husband which was made by [redacted] the morning of October 18, 2014 as he was released from custody. The voicemail appeared to be an open line or a failure to properly hang up the phone. The call was made from the police department 401-568-9496 taped line to [redacted] the phone number of [redacted]. [redacted] never answered the phone nor did he pick up his son [redacted] from the police station.

The phone message was forwarded from [redacted] to [redacted] who then filed the complaint. The message lasted just under five minutes and was also recorded on the police department recording system. It appears that the phone was passed back to the dispatcher by [redacted] from the lobby but was never hung up. The

recording picked up discussion, radio traffic and phone conversations. The officers identified in the message were Officer [redacted], Officer [redacted] and Sergeant [redacted] and [redacted]. The topic of discussion on the phone message was the fact that Officer [redacted] was advised by radio to pick up [redacted] and give him a ride home. [redacted] drove past [redacted] while he was in the front of the building. [redacted] Officer [redacted] and [redacted] made numerous comments and laughed at the fact that Officer [redacted] did not give [redacted] a ride and drove right by him. The message also recorded an incoming phone call from Officer [redacted] to [redacted] asked [redacted] he was going to give [redacted] a ride and [redacted] refused. There was more conversation and unprofessional comments. The message ended when it reached the maximum time for recording.

On November 19 at 1320 hours, [redacted] and her son [redacted] entered the station at the request of [redacted] to give information regarding this complaint. The interview was conducted by [redacted] and assisted by [redacted]. [redacted] was asked about his arrest and how he was treated during the process. [redacted] stated he was never harassed or treated poorly during the arrest. His main concern was that he felt he was the victim in this case and should not have been arrested. We advised [redacted] that the case had already been adjudicated by the courts and that was not something we could discuss since the case is closed. Our concern was to investigate his mother's complaint that he was treated poorly and was harassed by officers of this department.

[redacted] gave the following information: He was released at approximately 3:30 a.m. [redacted] was told it would be a couple of hours before the police would be free to give him a ride home. While he was standing in the lobby, he was handed the remote phone through the window in dispatch so he could call for a ride. He dialed his father's number and there was no answer so he then handed the phone back to the dispatcher but he never hung up the phone. [redacted] then left the building. As he stood outside a cruiser came through the gate and drove past him. He began to walk home. He said he went left down Victory Highway and then turned right onto Callahan School Street to Whipple Ave past the High School. He stated during his walk home another cruiser passed him on Chapel Street. When asked, [redacted] stated that at no time did



the officer in the cruiser that passed him harass him in any way and he could not see or identify the officers driving the cruisers.

We then asked _____ after hearing her son's story what her complaint was. _____ stated she was upset that the phone message of the police officers "busting her son's balls behind his back" was unprofessional and that she didn't feel comfortable with her town police officers acting that way. She felt a lack of trust in the police department. _____ was advised at that time that the message had been reviewed and the officers were identified. She was told that the Police Chief is aware and will take the appropriate action regarding the officer's conduct. _____ apologized to _____ for the actions of the officers and that the matter will be handled internal. _____ thanked the officers and said that would be sufficient, she was satisfied. _____ and _____ left the building at 1345 hours.



COMPLAINT NARRATIVE

SUBJECT: Internal Affairs Complaint received November 20, 2014

COMPLAINANT:

COMPLAINT: The complainant stated that her son [REDACTED] was the subject of verbal abuse by several members of the Burrillville Police Department after having been released from custody

INVESTIGATION: On October 17, 2014 at approximately 1:25 AM [REDACTED] age 20, 136 Church St. was arrested and charged with a simple assault after having been involved in an altercation with his ex-employer, a [REDACTED], age 36. [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] was transported to police headquarters where he was booked. At approximately 3:30 AM, [REDACTED] was released and allowed to make a phone call to arrange for transportation home. He attempted to contact his father with no luck. [REDACTED] then stated that he would be walking home. The investigation shows that when [REDACTED] returned the portable phone that he was allowed to use, it did not disconnect from the call. This led to an approximate 5 minute voice mail message being left on his father's phone. On the message can be heard the voices of Sgt. [REDACTED], Officer [REDACTED], Officer [REDACTED], and Dispatcher [REDACTED]. All of the personnel involved are heard making disparaging remarks about [REDACTED]

FINDINGS: As a result of this incident, Sgt. [REDACTED] was given a verbal reprimand for his management of all his officers' behaviors as [REDACTED] was exiting the building.
