Judy Annette Leuthard Cummings joined her beloved Ernie at the age of 80. Judy passed away in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on September 9, 2023, due to complications from surgery.

Judy was born on May 27, 1943, to John and Garnett Leuthard in Denver, Colorado. During her childhood her parents moved around so her education included not only Denver but Long Beach, California. In 1954, the family moved from Long Beach back to Denver and

Eighteen years of her teaching career she sponsored Future Business Leaders of America, a student organization. During her teaching years she was very active in many business organizations, and she received awards, one for Best Business Teacher and another for Teacher of the Year at Campbell County High School. She was also inducted into Wyoming's Business Teachers Hall of Fame. In 1997 she and Ernie retired and spent the next 20 years traveling extensively.

Judy enjoyed knitting, crocheting, reading, working crossword puzzles and was an avid TV watcher. She and Ernie enjoyed watching all sports and were devoted Bronco fans. Judy also enjoyed writing and self-published four books, shocking her friends with their content which caused many to blush.

After Ernie's passing in 2021, Judy faced health concerns of her own as she was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Judy was staying with her sister for the last nine months as she received pancreatic cancer treatment in Oklahoma City.
