STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



On the last Monday in May we observe Memorial Day, honoring those who died while serving in the U.S. military. In this Story From the 1917 Wall, we meet the first man from Orange killed in World War I: Clarence Otto Rozell (who went by his middle name, Otto).

Otto was born to Charles and Clara Rozell on July 21, 1898 in Otisco Township, Michigan, a small town northeast of Grand Rapids. Sometime after 1910 the family made its way to Orange, where Otto attended Orange Union High School (located in buildings now occupied by Chapman University). Newspapers from 1918 recount that Otto was a popular high school student with a strong athletic record in football, basketball and track. He enlisted in the US Marine Corps on January 14, 1918 when he was 19 years old.

As part of the 6th USMC Regiment, 2nd Division, Otto served at Château-Thierry, France, during a victorious allied push from the Marne to the Vesle river in July 1918. This counter-offensive, known as the Second Battle of the Marne, marked the start of the relentless allied advance which culminated in the armistice with Germany about 100 days later.

Sadly, Otto was severely injured with a shrapnel wound on July 21, 1918 (his 20th birthday). He had six fractured ribs and a hemorrhage of the lower lobe of his right lung. He passed six days later.

Because news of Otto's injury/death came piecemeal, with agonizingly slow gaps between updates, Otto's parents at first refused to believe he was dead, newspapers reported. Hope was extinguished, however, when they received detailed letters from the chaplain who oversaw Otto's funeral and a fellow Marine who served alongside Otto when he was injured.

Otto was laid to rest at the American Cemetery and Memorial in Suresnes, France, just three miles west of central Paris (with views of the Eiffel Tower). The 7.5-acre cemetery contains the remains of 1,559 Americans who died in World War I and 23 unknown dead of World War II. Otto's brother, Vernon Rozell (who served in the Army during World War I and is also on the 1917 Wall at American Legion Post 132), visited the cemetery sometime after Otto's death and stated that it was one of the prettiest places he has ever seen.

In September 1918 Otto's high school held a memorial for the school's hero classmate. We too remember Private Rozell and thank him for his sacrifice and valor in the pursuit of freedom.
