Summer is here. Before other commitments intrude, I wanted to bring you up-to-date on neighborhood happenings.

Probably the biggest issue for Royal Ridge is the proposed building of a Dollar General Store at the southwest corner of Landmark and Randolph Blvd. Residents of Amberton Apartments will be most directly affected, but many of our neighbors have concerns. I have requested comments from our various Home Owners Associations (HOAs), but have only received input from Patio Homes II and Royal Ridge Recreation Club. They are both opposed to the project.

The reason that this is an issue for us is that the developer has to get a zoning change approved. We have some time. Because the zoning change has not yet been formally proposed. As you decide, please keep in mind that the land will eventually be developed. A change to C3R zoning is the best solution because the R designation will prevent a neighborhood bar should Dollar General decide to move in the future. So, are you in favor of the change from industrial zoning to commercial? Don't call me, but please let Mike Gallagher's office know your position. Councilman Mike Gallagher can be reached at district10@sanantonio.gov and 210-207-7276.

Another issue of concern is the recent thefts of potted plants from homes in Royal Ridge. Of course, if you see something, say something. Security cameras may help the situation, but so far, we don't have evidence or leads that we can give to the police.

This leads me to the news of settlement of the contract dispute between the Police Officer's Association and the City of San Antonio. I am happy to see this resolved (pending approval by both the city council and by the police officers). I do have a concern that the agreement allows police and fire pay to exceed 66% of the budget at the end of five years. However, I believe that our City Manager, Sheryl Sculley, has done a great job attempting to balance the competing interests of Bexar County

property owners who pay the taxes and the uniformed officers who protect us and our property.

On June 25, the Bowen Center for Neighborhood Advocacy held a workshop about growing strong neighborhoods with active membership and dedicated leadership. It emphasized the impact we have on home values by either participation or failure to participate in our neighborhoods. I encourage our neighbors who are in their 30s, 40s and 50s to become involved. Recent studies show that the most HOAs are manned by individuals in their 60s and older. Those of us who are older would be more than happy to have additional help. And, our younger neighbors can have on-the-job training before our existing officers and Board members involuntarily vacate our positions, courtesy of Father Time. Give me a call to volunteer.

### ROYAL RIDGE CITIZENS ON PATROL

Those of you who read the Royal Ridge Recorder when it comes out will likely recognize this article as a recast of two prior ones. As I have said before, Royal Ridge Citizens on Patrol (RR COP) members continue their commitment to our collective security through daily patrols albeit we are fewer in number. We all benefit from these neighbors' vigilance and efforts and we owe them a big thank you. We also appreciate our neighbors who took the time and effort to be trained by the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) to better prepare themselves to call the SAPD on seeing criminal or suspicious activity. Again, we truly appreciate each of you and your individual and collective efforts.

We need additional members though to continue providing the level of patrol coverage we have in the past. We are still at just over 30 active members and historically we have had 40 plus. As a result, several members are called on to patrol twice each month and of late, some three times. We have also had a couple of open dates over the past several months as I refuse to schedule anyone more than three times (previously two).

Can we coax a few more of you to join us? There are over a thousand homes in the Royal Ridge neighborhoods and RR COP members come from less than 3% of them. Surely we see the need and hopefully a few of you will find the time to train and patrol with us. RR COP needs you!

I don't expect all of our neighbors have the time or desire to participate but I need to let everyone know this organization is no longer able to patrol at least two hours a day each day. If we don't have the coverage we have had in the past, then I'd expect

we will no longer enjoy the relatively low crime rate we presently experience. While we have a few residence and vehicle burglaries and thefts each month, daily crime reports indicate we are in a donut hole so to speak. There is a lot more going on around us. I attribute that donut hole to RR COP member patrols, concerned and involved neighbors' vigilance and reporting, and SAPD responses.



We urgently need more RR COP members though to help keep the criminals plying their trade elsewhere. Unless there is an added class in August, the last opportunity for *SAPD COP training* has passed until fall. The current fall schedule shows two Saturday morning classes, *September 10* and *November 5*, and two Monday evening classes, *October 3* and *December 5*. Saturday classes are held from 9 AM -1 PM and Monday classes from 6 PM -10 PM. All classes are scheduled to be held at the SAPD North Substation and only one-four hour session is required. Please give serious thought to taking the training and joining RR COP to help keep our crime rate at a minimum. Plan now to become involved!


