# Easter Faith and The 500th Anniversary Of The Reformation The Rev. Dr. Alden W. Towberman, Dean

"He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!" Easter Joy awaits us as we make our way to the empty tomb.

As those words resonate throughout all of Christendom and are spoken in all our churches of the Mid-Northeast Mission District I encourage you to think ahead and connect them with the many events that are being planned as we prepare to celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation.

Without an Easter Spirit one would mistakenly conclude

that the Reformation was primarily about doctrine, a power struggle with Rome, the selling of indulgences, putting the Bible in the hands of the people, the singing of hymns in worship and putting the worship service (mass) in the language of the people. All of this is important of course but... Without an Easter Spirit our churches lack vitality in their witness of the Gospel, our Lutheran doctrines become an end in themselves rather than a means of grace

and encounter with a Living Savior. Make sure you connect Easter with the Reformation as we are about our mission for the renewal of the Church in each of our congregations in the NALC. The two go together.

Rightly understood the Reformation began because of the rediscovery of Easter Faith in the life of Church centered around the Living Word of God and Faith grounded in God's Grace for sinners who God loves with all of God's heart!

The Reformation began before the nailing of the 95

Theses on the Castle Church Door in 1517. It began with the Living Lord encountering Martin Luther through the Scripture as he was teaching a class at Wittenberg University, Germany, on the Epistle of Romans.

What does it mean, Luther asked, "that the righteous shall live by faith?" To paraphrase Luther, 'Whoa, you mean the righteousness by which I will be saved, is not mine?' It's what he called a *justitia alienum*, an alien

> righteousness; a righteousness that belongs properly to somebody else. – namely the righteousness of Christ. And then Luther said: "When I discovered that, I was born again of the Holy Ghost. And the doors of paradise swung open, and I walked through." It was out of this 'religious experience,' this encounter with the Living Christ, through the Word of God that the Reformation – the Spirit of Easter again filled the Church of Christ. So may it

be among us.

"Easter, Word, Grace and Reformation" are meant to be spoken in one breath.

So how will you celebrate the Reformation year? It's about so much more than history. It's about so much more than celebrating our ethnic roots and heritage, it's about so much more than holding a Lutheran hymn fest. The 500th Anniversary of the Reformation brings the opportunity to be encountered by a Living Savior and to be an Easter Church. (*cont. on page 10*)

# **CAMP IN-TENTS DEDICATION**

Many of us have fond memories of spending time at a church camp during our childhood. It was a time of making new friends, getting out in nature, and discovering that we could worship outside of a church building. For many of us it was the time for growing closer to God and first hearing a call to serve our Lord.

Camping has always been an important aspect of growing up Lutheran and it became a concern in recent years that camps affiliated with our previous church bodies were not promoting orthodox Christian teachings. This was a concern in the Mid-Northeast Mission District.

One of the congregations in the Laurel Mountains east of Pittsburgh, Pa., decided that they would offer their campus to be the location for a camp for the Mission District. Their land includes a grove with a large enclosed building used as an eating and gathering area with a large kitchen that could serve as a mess hall, a campfire area, a large meadow where many tents could be set up, along with other out buildings, and a lovely outdoor chapel set back in the woods. There is also a volleyball court, a baseball field, and a basketball court, along with plenty of space to play games like Capture the Flag.

The first year of camp was 2015 with the theme "Going Against the Flow" and discussions were based on where God is when bad things happen. Part of the camp was a field trip to the Flight 93 Memorial (the plane that went down on Sept. 11, 2001). Our first year had 25 campers.

Last year we increased to 40 campers with the theme "Rooted in Christ." We looked at how we are all connected as part of God's family and how one person's actions can affect many others. We visited the Johnstown Flood National Park and the Flood Museum in the City of Johnstown and finished that day with a trip to a local dam for swimming and recreation.

During last year's camp a name was chosen for the camp, and since we sleep in tents the name is In"Tents" Lutheran Church Camp. In many ways the camp is intense.

For the first two years the camp was only two and a half days long, but the youth requested that we extend the camp time. This year the camp will be four days — starting on Monday morning, July 24, and ending Thursday afternoon, July 27. The theme will be "Living Water - Living Bread" as we focus on the sacraments and a little on the Reformation. Our trip this year (we travel by bus) will be to Ohiopyle, a beautiful state park in the Laurel Highlands of Pennsylvania, for white-water rafting, hiking, etc.

We are planning a service time at a local food pantry and thrift shop. There also will be opportunity for swimming during the week. Since the camp is extended to four days, showers are being installed at the camp as a necessary addition.

There will be a guest speaker at this year's camp. Brian Wallace, author and well-known speaker at Lutheran Youth Encounter events for many years and a speaker for Quakes for Life Promotions, will be bringing his wisdom and humor.



# Report of Mission District mission trip to Connellsville, PA

# on March 18, 2017

On a cold, damp and sometimes rainy day nearly 30 individuals from across our Mission District spent the day in Connellsville. Our group split up into three different working teams. A group of volunteers spent the day hanging drywall in a home. A second group was working in another home, tearing out carpet and cleaning out a basement. A third group loaded up vehicles with boxes of food and delivered them to 37 families who were flooded.

Each group spent time listening to the stories that the people shared. Among the common concerns that many shared was the fears of continued flooding. In fact, many people still deal with water coming into their homes. Thankfully, it is not on the scale that they first experienced. Along the way in the delivery of the food, the group saw houses marked for demolition. They saw what is a small creek that soared to a raging river that carried many a people's belongings into a heavily wooded area. Yet, the one common thread throughout the day was hearing the appreciation individuals and families have for the numerous groups who have come to their aid since August. Each one, not only welcomed our listening presence, our work, but also our prayers. Yes, we prayed with each family. This is one thing that sets us apart from some of the other groups that have visited.

The congregations participating were Christ, Rupp, The Elderton Lutheran Parish, St. Mark, Butler, and St. Paul, Latrobe (Trauger). The Mission trip was planned by our Mission District Youth Planning Team, chaired by Pastor Nila Cogan. The group concluded their day together with a dinner at Carson's Restaurant in Scottdale.
