Oscar Wilde once wrote, "A cynic is someone who knows the price of everything and the value of nothing." I

hope that I am never identified as a cynical man. Such a man is negative about everyone and everything people do and tends toward suspicion of ever motive. You've heard the popular cliché that "one bad apple can ruin the whole bunch"? That's a sentiment on the road to cynicism. I invite you to take these next 40 days of Lent to consider what is of value in your life and compare it with what God seems to value. And as you contemplate value factor in what price you are willing to pay to show that worth (value) in your life.

When Jesus takes his 40 days and nights in the wilderness, after his baptism by John, he does this very thing. Jesus considers what is valuable and what it's worth for him and for the Father. What price will Jesus pay now and at the end? I believe that Lent is God's gift to us to keep us from becoming cynical in a world that seems out to get us at every turn where "no good deed goes unpunished." (I don't believe that ②). This year's Lenten journey is a great opportunity to "take stock" and consider priorities and growing edges in our daily walk with God regarding family, work, attitudes, and self. The promise of this journey is resurrection but only after death occurs in some forms or shapes.

"Then Jesus said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23)

"...and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me." (Matthew 10:38)

These two verses from the gospels drop in our laps the question of how much we value Jesus in our living day to day. What does it mean to deny yourself? Well, it means "get real and be honest with yourself about your situation" no excuses, no blame, no rationalizing it away – take a good look in the mirror. And next, talk to the Father, and ask God to show you again how God sees you and what that means for your life. Jesus gives us a new direction to take up your cross but first you will have to let go of some things to carry that cross. When we face death, what is of value in our hearts, in our spirit...to follow Jesus is the last mark of this journey. Jesus goes to die because he must for your sake and mine. Jesus took up his cross for love – not convenience, obligation, or obedience – but love. What we bear in love is never truly a burden because it is of value! At the end comes the promise of new life, God's gift to us. We are reborn with a perspective that knows the value of somethings, essential things, and the price that is paid for it by God and other's in our lives love!

Not one of us is worthy of Jesus and yet Jesus makes us worthy and shows us our worth in the heart of God. I hope that this Lent season gives you a chance to perceive the true value in relationships, vocation, and devotion.

Let us pray. Gracious God, open our hearts and minds this Lent to what is of the most value to us and to you, so that we might reflect, give thanks, let go and orient our journey with you into abundant life for the sake of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. Amen.

Helping Kids Thrive

Janey was transitioning from elementary school to junior high, and she was experiencing anxiety about the big jump. She was worried about meeting new kids and new teachers, and she would have panic attacks whenever her mom would wake her up for school. Last year, when kids across the state were already feeling added stress and pressure, she missed weeks of school at a time.

Her family knew she needed extra encouragement and a shoulder to lean on. They found it through LSI Behavioral Health Intervention Services (BHIS), which provide in-home programming for Iowa children and teens with severe emotional or behavioral disorders. Through the programming, families can practice developing skills like healthy communication, anger management, and problem solving.

Through LSI's BHIS programming, Janey was able to build coping skills to help her calm down and avoid overthinking worst-case scenarios about her school day. With her LSI worker, she practiced relationship skill-building – how to build friendships and stay away from others who could make school time hard.

After working on these skills multiple times each week, Janey was able to succeed in her classes. She went from failing several classes due to missing school to recently receiving a certificate showing she was on the honor roll.
