**NOMINATION BANQUET** – Mr. Rude reported the Banquet is scheduled for Oct. 19, and submitted a bill for table decos of \$122.10. After significant member input, Mr. Rude decided to forego the door prizes, and instead credit each participants' dinner by \$5, in an effort to maintain an affordable banquet for members. **MODEL A YOUTH RESTORATION AWARD** – Mrs. Jammer reported that she received a letter from the MAYRA program soliciting Chapters and Regions of the MAFCA and MARC for a donation to support the program. The program provides financial support to youth whose interest in the hobby is demonstrated by their efforts in restoring a Model A. Mrs. Jammer requests that the MAYRA program be listed as possible charitable organization that members will be voting on.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

**TCF Bank Accounts** have been moved from the Small Business Money Market at .01% annually to Business Premier Money Market to .35% annually with a rate guaranteed for 180 days, a percentage increase of 3400%, thus, the club will be making 35 times more.

**Plaque frames-** Mr. Rude presented the Board with plaque frames he had purchased on behalf of the club for years to come at a reasonable price, and will submit the receipt to the Treasurer for reimbursement.

**St Helena's Autumn Daze Parade** - Mr. Persing reported it was a beautiful day for the St Helena's Autumn Daze Parade in south Minneapolis where 4 Model A's were used to take the American Legion and Lions club through the parade. As a result, Wold-Chamberlain American Legion Post 99, and the Lions Club donated a combined total of \$150 to our club, and we received one personal donation for \$50 bringing the total donation to \$200. Donations were forwarded to Mel Eder for deposit. Thank you cards will be sent to Thom Boche, Bob Butek and David Granning for coming out to support this event, as well as to those who so kindly donated.

**Restoration Restrictions-**Mr. Peterson indicated there may be some issues in the future regarding hobbyists working on their own cars. Mrs. Jammer will collect the needed information, and forward it to Ken Huber-Government Affairs Committee Chair for his assessment. MAFCA and MARC may also be informed.

PHOTO CONTEST-On behalf of Mr. Leder, Mrs. Jammer confirmed with the Board that Mr. Leder would be allocated \$100 for Photo Contest prizes, the same as last year.




#### Seeking Board Nominations

# HISTORY OF THE BURMA - SHAVE SIGNS

BURMA – SHAVE (the product) arguably remains one of America's fondest-remembered products from the 1930's through the 1950's. Minneapolis lawyer Robert Ransom Odell was the founder of the Minnesota based BURMA – VITA COMPANY the manufacturer of liniment and later the brushless shaving cream known as BURMA SHAVE. The company was in tough financial shape in 1925 when the Odell's tried roadside advertising. Before the ground froze in 1926 a set of two signs were dug in alongside two roads leading out of Minneapolis on Minnesota Highway 65 to Albert Lea and Minnesota Highway 61 to Red Wing. By 1927 these first crude signs began to work. Also in late 1927 Henry Ford unveiled the "NEW FORD", the Ford "Model A". For a period of time, "the rest is history" for both companies.

By 1963 things had changed and the Burma – Vita Company was sold to Philip Morris. Philip Morris later discontinued all rights to the iconic signs. Some figures say that by the 1960's 700 different jingles on 40,000 signs had adorned the United States highways. For the Ford "Model A" it has been estimated that over 200,000 are today still in driving condition world wide but production of the "Model A" actually ceased in 1931.
