THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Some people who claim to be Christians actually say, "You know, I love the Lord. I just don't love the church."

Sorry, but that is impossible, because 1 John 5:1 says, "Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has become a child of God. And everyone who loves the Father loves his children, too." I have learned that when I become friends with someone I become friends with their children as well. If I love them, my love extends to their family. In a way, their children become like nieces and nephews to me.

In the same way, when we love God, we also will love God's children. And if you don't love God's children, then one has to question how much you really love God.

As a pastor, I have had people disagree with me on certain things, and I don't take offense to that. But it is a different matter altogether when it comes to my wife. One way to make sure that I am offended is to insult her, I take that personally.

The church is the bride of Christ. We belong to Him, and He loves us. In fact, the apostle Paul used that analogy in

Ephesians 5 when he wrote, "For husbands, this means love your wives, just as Christ loved the church. He gave up his life for her to make her holy and clean, washed by the cleansing of God's word" (verses 25–26). I love the phrase, "as Christ loved the church. He gave up His life for her..." Our Lord Jesus loved the church so much he died for it. What incredible love He has for the church. I want you to love the church that much, especially Chapel Hill.

HELP CHAPEL HILL RAISE MONEY FOR SPECIAL PROJECTS:

You can help Chapel Hill raise money by participating in the Scrips Program. All you have to do is your normal shopping and plan just a little! Participating companies allow non-profits, like us, to purchase shopping cards and keep a certain percentage. You get the benefit of a fully purchased card. Say you by a \$25 Cracker Barrel card. When you spend it, you will receive \$25 worth of food. Chapel Hill will keep 9% of the cost when it is paid for. That's \$2.25 that Chapel Hill has made from that one card!

There are multiple ways you can participate.

- 1. Each Sunday, myself or someone else will be selling cards before and after the 9:30 service. These are the most often purchased cards.
- 2. You can go on-line and place your own order and take advantage of the hundreds of participating companies.

3. If your not comfortable or don't have the access to a computer. You can fill out a order sheet and give it to me, or turn into the office during the week, what you would like to order from the hundreds of options. I can place the order for you.

If you place the order yourself, registration is easy and you only have to do it once. Go to the website: shopwithscrip.com. Click on the "Register" button. Click on "Join a Scrip Program". Enter Chapel Hill's enrollment number CD24A19C362L8. This is case sensitive. The next page will have you fill in some quick information and create a user name and password. Press save. Voilà! You are ready to place your own order.

ELEVEN WAYS TO SUPPORT THE MINISTRIES AT YOUR CHURCH

- 1. **Gift of Cash**—Cash gifts may be deducted for one year or over six years, up to 50% of adjusted gross income. For example, on a \$10,000 cash gift in a 25% tax bracket, you may save \$2,500 in taxes. The church also welcomes cash gifts and pledges that are payable over a period of years.
- 2. **Appreciated Stock**—Appreciated stock (held more than one year) makes an excellent gift. You may avoid capital gain taxes and receive a charitable tax deduction for the full market value of the stock.
- 3. **Bequest Through Your Will** Your Last Will and Testament is your final opportunity to make a lasting gift to your church and remind your loved ones of your faith. You may make a bequest by providing a dollar amount, specific property, a percentage of your estate, or what is left (the "remainder"). In many cases a simple codicil to your Will can add the church and does not require rewriting your Will.
- 4. Charitable Remainder Trusts (Annuity and Unitrust) Members may benefit from lifelong payments from such a trust. The member selects the rate of return from these income-producing trust arrangements and may choose a fixed or fluctuating annual payment to be made to the designated parties as long as they live. Capital gain taxes may be minimized, and you may receive a tax deduction based on the age of the income recipient and the rate of return. The remainder gift come to the church.
- 5. Charitable Lead Trust—In a charitable lead trust, assets (generally cash or securities) are transferred to a trust which pays income to the church for a number of years which you determine. At the end of the designated time period, the trust terminates and the assets revert to you or are given to the person(s) you name. This trust can help lower estate and gift taxes that would otherwise be due on the value of assets. This charitable vehicle is especially attractive if a member wishes to leave assets to children or grandchildren in the future.
- 6. Charitable Gift Annuity—In exchange for a gift of cash or marketable securities, the Kentucky United Methodist Foundation will pay you (or your spouse) a fixed, annual income for life. Your rate depends upon your age—the older you are, the higher the rate. In addition, you may receive a substantial income tax deduction the year of the gift, and a portion of the annual payment you receive is not taxed. Upon the death of the beneficiaries the remainder

- goes to your church.
- 7. Deferred Charitable Gift Annuity—A deferred charitable gift annuity is similar to a regular charitable gift annuity, but payments begin at some future date. Your tax deduction and annual rate of return on your annuity increase the longer you wait to start payments. This can be an excellent retirement planning vehicle to implement during prime income-earning years. The charitable remainder gift goes to your church.
- 8. Gift of Life Insurance—Life insurance can be another way to make a substantial future charitable gift. Gifts of life insurance can be made either by designating your church as beneficiary or by irrevocably assigning ownership of the policy to the church. Beneficiary designations alone produce no income tax deductions but may remove the proceeds from the donor's taxable estate upon death. Assignment of the policy to the church may create a current income tax deduction for the present value of the policy. In addition, annual income tax deductions may be allowed for any premiums the donor voluntarily continues to pay when ownership has been assigned to the church.
- 9. Retirement Accounts and Pension Plans—Retirement plan assets may be subject to taxation levels that minimize their benefit to heirs if tax-wise planning is not arranged. It is sometimes more tax-effective to gift retirement plan assets, and then use other assets to furnish heirs with an inheritance. Retirement plans (IRAs or qualified company plans) may be given to your church with proper beneficiary designation and planning.
- 10. Gifts of Real Estate—For some individuals a gift of land, a house, or a vacation home is a preferred way to make a gift. You may receive a tax deduction for the full market value, minimize capital gain taxes, and remove the asset from future estate taxes. One option to an outright gift is to give real estate and retain a life tenancy. This can provide a current income tax benefit. You continue to live there, maintain the property and even receive any income it generates. At your death the property reverts to your church.
- 11. Creative Combinations—In planned giving one size does not fit all. Depending upon your circumstances and gift objectives, you may use one or even several planned giving vehicles to achieve the goals best suited for you.

- Plan and implement an annual event that will focus on displaying the musical/vocal talents of Chapel Hill, as well as create an interest in attending Chapel Hill for those without a church home.

You will see some of our team members at the welcome desk each Sunday morning. They are there to help newcomers, as well as our "regulars", by answering questions, supplying "emergency" items, and greeting everyone. Please stop by and say hello as you come into our church.

We welcome ideas and suggestions as to how we can best accomplish our purpose. If you have ideas or suggestions about activities and events, please write them down and give it to our person at the welcome desk. We are

FINANCE/STEWARDSHIP: By Steve Hoskins

The Finance/Stewardship Committee would like to express our sincere thanks and appreciation to Janet Faught who has chaired this committee in the past. Janet's foresight and professionalism was always very uplifting and we will miss her expertise. THANK YOU, JANET.

This year, 2017, we will have co-chairs; Brian Poynter and myself. If you do not know Brian, please make it a point to introduce yourself. He is a great addition to the committee and is open to your thoughts, questions and ideas.

This time last year, we were kicking off our THRIVE program, and as Chapel Hill usually does, the response was impressive. With your generous response to the church's needs, we were able to accomplish 2 of our 3 goals. Our immediate goals; re-roofing the administration wing and a return of program budgets to the level of 2009, before we began construction on our Children and Youth wing, were both met. Our third goal, that of establishing a 3 -month reserve of operating expenses is still a work in progress and we will be putting forth a new effort on the THRIVE program.

Our new Finance/Stewardship committee remains very transparent in our dealings and the finances of Chapel

Hill are always open and available to any interested party. Our monthly meetings are open to anyone and you are welcome to attend.

And finally, a word about our building program. Our initial investment in the Children and Youth wing and the lives of our children and the future of Chapel Hill was well over 2 million dollars. Currently, our mortgage on the property is less than \$750,000.00! THANK YOU LORD! The Finance committee has been very responsible and diligent in our administration of this obligation. By refinancing the debt in 2016 we were able to save about \$7,500.00 in interest. Our current monthly obligation is close to \$5,500.00 for debt retirement on this addition.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could relieve ourselves of this obligation and use that same amount to help the needy and the lost in our community. Imagine the impact we could have for the glory of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! If each family would give an additional \$5 or \$10 per week, specified for the building fund, this debt can be retired years ahead of time and allow us to have more outreach programs and influence in our community.



WHY ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY?

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. Ash Wednesday emphasizes two themes: our sinfulness before God and our human mortality. The service focuses on both themes, helping us to realize that both have been triumphed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

During some Ash Wednesday services, the minister will lightly rub the sign of the cross with ashes onto the foreheads of worshipers. The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. Historically, ashes signified purification and sorrow for sins. It is traditional to save the palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday service to burn to produce ashes for this service. Sometimes a small card or piece of paper is distributed on which each person writes a sin or hurtful or unjust characteristic. The cards are then brought to the altar to be burned with the palm branches. The ash cross on the forehead is an outward sign of our sorrow and repentance for sins.
