God's Encouraging Word ... when I feel hopeless

I was staring up through the water at my dad, my uncle, and their friend. I could hear them talking and laughing. I can remember flailing my arms and legs. I tried to scream but water rushed into my lungs. I sank further and further down. I was drowning and I felt utterly hopeless.

Then a large hand grabbed me by the back of my swimsuit and pulled me from the water. As my head broke the surface of the water, I gasped for air. My dad wrapped his arms around me and told me everything would be alright.

To this day I remember the name of my dad's friend who pulled me from the water. Although I haven't seen him in over 30 years, I am forever grateful that he saved my life.

Horicon Second Site / Mission Church Update

This past April, the WELS Board for Home Missions (BHM) approved our proposal to start a second site in Horicon. That means that our synod will help, encourage and pray for us as we reach out to those who don't know Christ in Horicon. By obtaining mission approval, we are also able to apply for several financial grants that will help us get a running start as we begin things this summer.

- Our plan is to rent the Koepsell-Murray Funeral Home located at 716 Clinton Street · Horicon, WI 53032.
- Our plan is to begin regular Saturday night worship services at 5:00 p.m. beginning June 2.
- Our plan is use a core group of members of St. John's, most of whom live in Horicon, to do most of the "heavy lifting".
- Our plan is to encourage all the members of St. John's to do outreach, pray for the growth of God's kingdom and to support the efforts being done.

By God's grace, the second site in Horicon will not affect the budget at St. John's due (at least in its first year) to a generous and anonymous gift from our congregation.

On Sunday, May 13th after each service, a short slide show presentation will be given updating our church on the progress of planning our second site in Horicon. God-willing, this will be the first of many to come. There will also be a short survey to asking how many of you plan on using the Saturday service on a regular, semi-regular or not at all basis.

St. John's in Horicon is St. John's Juneau. We are now going to be two campuses, but remain one church, St. John's. Pastor Brandt and Schupmann will preach at both campuses. The offerings will be united. The attendance and communion attendance all tracked together. At this time, all major services like Thanksgiving, Christmas will be held at the St. John's Juneau campus.

Central Africa Medical Mission - Lutheran Mobile Clinic (Malawi) April 2018

It is still the rainy season in Malawi with hit or miss afternoon showers most days. February and March had regular rains for crops but there was an unusually dry period in January, such that fields of maize (the staple crop here) failed to grow. Some people planted a second crop and we see some healthy maize fields which will soon be ready to harvest. It is the right amount of moisture at the right time which can determine whether Malawians go hungry next year or not. But where there is standing water, mosquitos thrive, and as they are the vector for malaria parasites getting into people's bloodstreams, malarial illness increases. In March the LMC staff have treated over 1200 patients who tested positive for malaria, with a total number of patients seen for all reasons totaling nearly 5,000.

As part of the Malawian Nursing Registration process, the nurse in charge must initially spend time in the government hospital working on various wards. As challenging as these shifts are, I am always reminded that the Lutheran Mobile Clinic is helping to keep children and adults out of the hospital. The primary health care we do is focused on prevention using screening, immunization, education and early treatment for things like malnutrition, diarrhea, and anemia, as well as malaria. Pregnant women and their babies are healthier due to being seen at our antenatal clinic, receiving insecticide treated mosquito nets, iron and folic acid, tetanus vaccine, screening for HIV, and malaria treatment as needed. The devastating consequences I have seen in the hospital of malaria- severe anemia from destruction of red blood cells, very low blood glucose, damage to the brain and other organs, and infections such as pneumonia, are less likely to happen due to the care our clinic provides in four different villages outside of Lilongwe.

Having been a part of CAMM in Malawi in the 1980's, and returning now, I am again familiar with the feeling that there is always something to trust God for. It may be the traffic and dangerous roads or it may be having a full staff each day we go to clinic. It could be having the needed medicines and test kits available for our work, or it might be having electricity available to keep our vaccines cold. It is certainly also trusting Him for the health and safety of loved ones in the US. We are always thankful for each day's end where we have seen answered prayers and abundant grace. Your prayers make a difference.

My husband Gary will be joining me this week to start his orientation to become the clinic administrator for the next 3 years. We intend to continue the good stewardship that the previous administrators have done with the very careful use of funds, thus managing to keep the budget balanced despite no longer having government help for our staff salaries. Your financial gifts are generous, timely and necessary. The pill bottles used for dispensing liquid medicine, sunscreen for albino children, cards and letters are much appreciated.

I am looking forward to worshipping at a the Easter service in Mwaleloumwe, one of the villages we serve. May the good news of Jesus continue to be spread both in Zambia and Malawi through our Lutheran pastors, medical clinics and those of you at home who sustain this gospel outreach.

Unless Someone Explains It

"Go south to the road - the desert road - that leads down from Jerusalem," he was told. When Philip went, he met the Ethiopian man who was reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

"Go to that chariot and stay near it," the angel directed. When Philip did so, he asked a very important question - "Do you understand what you are reading?"

The Ethiopian's answer was straightforward: "How can I, unless someone explains it to me?" Philip used the very passage the Ethiopian was reading, from Isaiah 53 ("he was led like a sheep to the slaughter") to tell the good news about Jesus. Ultimately, the Ethiopian was baptized on that desert road.

At Wisconsin Lutheran Chapel in Madison, WI, our doors are open to all students on the Madison campuses. There are many occasions that remind us of the story of Philip and the Ethiopian. Students enter our building not knowing exactly what they are seeking, and the Lord gives us the privilege of being the ones who explain the good news about Jesus to them.

Last fall, one such student arrived at the Chapel, seeking answers about God's Word. Through several contacts with the Word, the seed of gospel truth was planted and watered, and God made it grow.

In late October, Manaporn "Mint" Phaosricharoen was baptized - but not in our Chapel. She requested the opportunity to be immersed because that picture of washing away sins was important to her. So we braved the wind and chilly temperatures and entered the brisk waters of Lake Mendota for Mint to receive the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.

The power of God's Word is truly amazing. The opportunities God presents to share the power of that Word are equally amazing. Mint came to us seeking answers, needing someone to explain to her the truth of the gospel. God placed the Chapel in the right place and at the right time to offer her the answers for which she was searching.

Campus Ministry opportunities aren't limited to the Madison area. At colleges throughout the country, our campus pastors delight in the opportunities God gives them to witness to young adults who are searching for what is truly important. "Unless someone explains it" could be said by many of them. Campus pastors continue to plant and water seeds with the Word of God, trusting that God, who works powerfully through his Word, will make those seeds grow.

Sometimes, God gives the special privilege of wading into an icy lake to baptize one of them!

Exciting ministry opportunity in Vietnam

Since 2015, WELS has consistently been sending members of the Global Hmong Committee and the Pastoral Studies Institute (PSI) to train leaders of the Hmong Fellowship Church (HFC) in Vietnam in sound, Lutheran doctrine. While much needs to be done before fellowship can be declared with this church body, its leaders have expressed a desire to learn Lutheran doctrine and to become a confessional Lutheran church body. Rev. Bounkeo Lor, Hmong Asia Ministry coordinator, has been leading these efforts, making multiple training visits per year.

In the three years WELS has provided training, the Hmong Fellowship Church has grown from 65,000 to 100,000 members and formed 53 new churches. The message of free grace received from Jesus Christ has replaced their old law-based preaching and leadership, and their churches are expanding as a result. Church leadership has stabilized, and the communist government in Vietnam has noticed this positive change.

Thanks to the Lord's ever-guiding hand and blessing, the Vietnamese government has invited WELS to build a theological training facility in the capital city of Hanoi. This is an amazing and unexpected opportunity for our synod. As the HFC looks to the future of their church body, they realize the importance of equipping the next generation of pastors with the truth of the gospel. WELS will continue to provide HFC leaders with theological instruction and pastoral training.


This opportunity for further gospel ministry is great, as WELS is currently the only protestant church with

official governmental permission to work with the Hmong in Vietnam. Our Home and World Missions team, the Synodical Council, and the Conference of Presidents are working tirelessly to fully evaluate and explore this opportunity, in addition to securing the funds needed for land acquisition, construction costs, and initial operating costs of the training facility. Watch for additional updates about this effort in the coming weeks and months.

As this opportunity lies before us, you may want to support Hmong ministry in Vietnam with a gift that will help to purchase land and build a training center in Hanoi. You can also continue to pray for our Christian brothers and sisters across the globe as they learn more about the freedom that comes through God's grace. Pray for continued blessings on the training that Rev. Lor and the PSI team are providing to the church leaders of the HFC.

- Sunday School continues to go well.

New Home Mission Projects Approved

On April 13, the Board for Home Missions approved support for seven new mission congregations as well as support to enhance mission-minded ministry at seven other congregations.

The ministries receiving financial support for a **new mission** include:

- Reno, Nev. Two area congregations are partnering to start this congregation in the Northern Valleys area of greater Reno. On March 25, the first worship service was held;
 63 people attended
- Phoenix, Ariz. Crosswalk, Phoenix, is opening a second site to reach out into downtown Phoenix.
- Joplin, Mo. A strong core of WELS and Evangelical Lutheran Synod members from the two nearest churches are helping support this mission.
- Brandon, S.D. Near Sioux
 Falls, this new congregation
 includes core members from
 two WELS churches and an Evangelical Lutheran Synod congregation.
- Milwaukee, Wis. Grace in downtown Milwaukee, one of WELS' original congregations, is establishing a new location in the area known as the Third Ward.


Two new multi-site starts were approved to receive **unsubsidized mission status**. Home Missions will provide assistance through its district mission boards, mission counselors, and synodical support staff, but the original congregations will provide 100 percent of the funding needed. These include:

- Hobart, Wis. Mount Olive, Suamico, Wis., is starting a second site in Hobart. The
 congregation is calling a second pastor to begin this new ministry.
- Horicon, Wis. Members of St. John's, Juneau, Wis., see an opportunity to reach out in nearby Horicon, where 90 members of St. John's live. Saturday worship services are scheduled to begin in Horicon in June.

Home Missions is also financially	
supporting mission-minded	
enhancements to these existing	
congregations:	

- Crown of Life, Corona, Calif. This multi-site mission currently has four different locations for worship. Home Mission funding will support a third pastor.
- Faith, Anchorage, Alaska A second bilingual pastor will allow Faith to enhance their Hispanic ministry.
- Grace, Seattle, Wash. Two congregations will be combining to restart their ministry in the heart of Seattle. Funding will allow a full-time pastor to again serve at Grace.
- Ascension, Harrisburg, Penn. Remaining members of Ascension are ready to restart their congregation. They have demonstrated they are willing to take on ministry responsibilities and support outreach efforts that will be guided by their next pastor.
- Shepherd of the Hills, Knoxville, Tenn. A group of members are ready to restart
 their congregation after a longer-term pastoral vacancy. With the congregation back on
 its feet, they hope to begin a preschool ministry in order to jump start their outreach
 efforts.
- Trinity, Waukesha, Wis. –
 Trinity hopes to reach out to
 a large population of Hispanics in their community by bringing in a bilingual pastor to lead the ministry.
- Epiphany and First, Racine, Wis. These two Racine congregations currently operate
 a joint Lutheran Elementary school. Home Mission funding will allow the school to call a
 staff minister or teacher to coordinate outreach efforts to prospective church families.





