What does it mean to be living Lutheran? For some it means no more than having a pulse and 2 membership in a Lutheran church. Being Lutheran does not necessarily inform your priorities or your activities. You may be among those who say, "I'm a member but I don't go." End of story. For others who were born and raised Lutheran it is a more fundamental identity, a way of thinking about oneself; almost on par with a family name or national origin. You cannot be anything other than Lutheran because it was sealed on your soul in your baptism. Living Lutheran is a way of life. There are those who were raised in another denomination and have joined a Lutheran Church later in life. Our reasons are varied, from the location of a certain church to the person you have married. Few people join a church because of its theology (how we think about God) or even worship style. Reasons to join a church are usually based on more practical considerations or family con-

service. There are two things I remember from that first visit: first, in attendance were people who greeted us warmly; and second, we heard a powerful sermon focused on God's grace. I had gone to church my entire life but had never heard a sermon that left me feeling so unconditionally loved by

We were in the new members class before I really began to think about what living Lutheran was all about. Soon after that I was attending seminary. Thirty years later I'm still growing in my understanding of what it means to be a living Lutheran, living more fully as a Lutheran Christian all

"Living Lutheran". For many years I put it on a pile of "maybe I'll get to it someday." For reasons I can't explain I began reading it just a few months ago (actually getting through some of those back issues). It starts off my day on the right track as it makes me feel proud of our church and my

Consequently I was interested that our bishop, Bishop Zeiser, made quite a pitch for this magazine when he met with clergy and lay people following the church wide assembly. Summing up his comments he said, "If you really want to know what kind of church this is read the

We are a church of ministry, offering compassion and care for those who struggle with all types of fundamental needs or fall victim to natural or man-made disasters. It is a church that welcomes the outsider and shows in word and deed God's amazing grace and love, just like the church we visited and joined so many years ago.

Copies of the "Living Lutheran" are available outside the church office. Take one home and see for yourself. Living Lutheran is a great read and a great way to live.






Also, there are brochures and information available on heating assistance, ways to conserve energy and general concerns of limited income families. Please contact the church for further information.
