CERATOPHYLLACEAE – HORNWORT FAMILY

Plant: herbs, aquatic and floating

Stem:

Root: none

<u>Leaves:</u> in whorls, mostly sessile, divided 1 or 2(3) times, usually with minute teeth; no stipules

<u>Flowers:</u> imperfect (monoecious), pistillate and staminate flowers from leaf axils or nodes; small and mostly solitary (or 2-3); no petals or sepals but with bracts; 3 to many stamens; ovary superior, 1 pistil, 1 style, 1 carpel, 1 ovule (may often reproduce by fragmentation)

Fruit: nutlet or achene

Other: ponds, lakes and small streams; worldwide; Dicotyledons Group

Genera: only one genus; ceratophyllum (hornwort)

Notes: aquatic, usually submerged shallow water plant; flower with no petals, sepals small and green, in leaf axils, most reproduction by breaking off of buds; leaves filiform, whorled, divided 1 time (sometimes 2 or 3), somewhat brittle, with fine teeth (projections), upper leaves crowded (hence name Coon's Tail); spring to fall [V Max Brown, 2014]
