Referendum on California Federal Order Continues until May 5 – The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has mailed ballots on a federal order for California to all eligible dairy producers and voting continues through May 5, 2018. CDC urges dairy producers to vote "Yes" in the ongoing statewide referendum to ensure that milk prices in California are brought in line with prices paid in the federal order system. U.S. House Agriculture Committee Passes Farm Bill — On Wednesday the U.S. House Agriculture Committee passed its version of the next farm bill in a party line vote with all 26 Republicans voting for the bill and all 20 Democrats opposing it. Under the bill, the Agriculture and Nutrition Act of 2018 (H.R. 2), the Margin Protection Program is renamed the Dairy Risk Management (DRM) program. The DRM significantly lowers premiums for milk production of 5 million pounds or less. Milk production not covered under the DRM is made fully eligible for other risk management program including the Livestock Gross Margin (LGM)-Dairy Program. Upon passage of the legislation National Farmers Union President Roger Johnson said, "This bill is wholly inadequate for providing family farmers with the resources they need to endure the worst decline in the farm economy in decades." *California Dairy Campaign and California Farmers Union oppose the dairy provisions in committee's farm bill because they will disadvantage dairy operations larger than 5 million lbs. of production, do not reflect accurate on farm margins and fail to incorporate incentive based inventory management to balance milk supply with market demand.*

CDFA will fund up to 100% of the total project cost with a maximum grant award of \$750,000 per project. To be eligible, the current baseline manure management practices must include the anaerobic decomposition of volatile solids stored in a lagoon or other predominantly liquid anaerobic environment.

Dairy Margin Protection Program (DMPP) Sign up through June 1, 2018 – Dairy producers can sign up for the DMPP throughout June 1, 2018. The DMPP was changed by the "Bipartisan Budget Act" which lowers premium rates for dairies producing 5 million pounds of milk or less. Dairy producers are eligible to sign up for both the DMPP and the Livestock Gross Margin (LGM) program which is a risk management program.
