
Quote in Closing

Financial Unplanning (Part 1)

If you followed the past articles regarding on-the-job injuries (or, more appropriately, financial disaster), we hope to have received your undivided attention. The following articles will be addressing financial situations you may or may not be familiar with in regards to financial security. Either way, good luck!


Emergency Funds

Mostly all financial advisers will recommend that each person should have a three-month reserve of cash in case of injury, job lay-off, etc. Realistically, we do not know of many people in the real world who can meet this recommendation, but if you have met this goal, congratulations! For those of you who have been attempting to build a nest egg, it always seems that something always comes up. If you have children, you can relate to expenses regarding private schools, college tuition, braces/orthodontist, driving lessons/vehicle repairs, new vehicles, etc.

Although items like your 401K, a second mortgage, refinancing your automobile, etc., are not considered as a means to fulfill this cash reserve, should a hardship be encountered, these areas may be of some direction to ease the burden.

Living between Pay Periods

In addition to a cash reserve, it is suggested that your checking account be on a month-to-month basis. In the real world...how about paycheck-to-paycheck! It does not matter what formula you have or use to sustain your lifestyle/living, "the more you make, the more you will spend."
