WE WELCOME The Rev. Canon Dr. Alan K. Salmon as celebrant and preacher this morning. Fr. Salmon was ordained in 1964 by Bishop Banyard and has spent his entire ministry in the Diocese of New Jersey. Born in Moorestown, NJ and raised in Trinity Church, he graduated from Trinity College, Hartford, Conn. (BA, MA); from the General Theological Seminary, NYC (M. Div.); and from Drew University, Madison, NJ (D.Min). He was curate at Trinity Church, Cranford, NJ, Vicar of St. Peter's, Woodbury Heights (later merged to become Holy Trinity, Wenonah), and retired in 2003 after 33 years as Rector of Christ Church, Riverton, NJ.

CHRIST CHURCH MUSIC MINISTRY: As we ease out of Covid-19 related restrictions, we are beginning to plan the resumption of our music program. Much of the 2020/21 choir year was lost due to the restrictions. While the parish has resumed public worship, we are aligning the return date for our choir ministries with CDC guidelines and the diocesan COVID policy.
