

Let There Be Light

"And God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness" (Genesis 1:3-4).

The authors of the Bible look back to the creation to speak to the way God's righteousness, wisdom, and goodness call us to him. We all benefit from physical light. How does God's light bless us *spiritually*?


God dispels our darkness. When we give in to sin, we embrace darkness, ignorance, and evil. Our understanding is "darkened" (Eph 4:18). In fact, our whole body is "full of darkness" (Matt 6:23). We live in the "domain of darkness" (Col 1:13). Just like the darkness hovers over the waters at creation, so we grope in desperation, cold, broken, and needy. So God sends Jesus into the world: "the true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world" (John 1:9). Just like light, we would expect that everyone would welcome him—but shockingly, many recoil from the light. "And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed" (John 3:19-20). They reject God's word because it convicts and shames them. This explains the universal human hesitancy of exposing our works to scrutiny. Yet the bright exposure of the light brings liberation and healing.

God teaches us to live in light. But there is more than the initial change God's light brings. Our first experiences with light mean that we can never go back to darkness in the same way. We crave light. We seek it out for the rest of our lives. In the same way, the light of God's truth is something we live in for the rest of our lives. "For at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light" (Eph 5:8). Paul's immediate application of this principle is to "take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them" (Eph 5:11). We no longer participate in the things that we used to while we lived in ignorance or rebellion, but instead call them out as evil. We are not led astray easily by false teachings "for you are all children of light, children of the day. We are not of the night or of the darkness" (1 Thess.5:5). Living in light means that we don't behave the way we used to: "For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, are drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation" (1 Thess. 5:7-8). Sobriety, trust, love for others, and a firm hope are all light-behaviors. They are not restricted to our conversions, but are ongoing spirits to pursue.

God creates light to be a blessing to mankind—to give him order, understanding, and awareness of himself and others. He has given us spiritual light too—for the same reasons.

Are we living in God's light? Are we shining that light before others?
