The Lake County Community Connect Resource Fair is returning to Two Harbors this October 30th at the AEOA building on 10th Street. Hosted by AEOA and Beacons of Hope, this event offers Lake County residents a chance to learn about available community resources in one place - resources ranging from food assistance, financial assistance, disability assistance, senior services, domestic abuse aid, Teen Challenge, and many more!

The event is modeled after the national Project Homeless Connect events that occur throughout the United States and provide multiple services in one location in one day. The Lake County Community Connect differs in that the event will serve not only those experiencing homelessness, but those households struggling to meet basic needs.

The fair will be focused on community health and wellness. Free resources will be available, including personal hygiene

products, door prizes, hair-cuts and snacks. This is a wonderful opportunity to visit with vendors and program representatives, seek assistance for living and personal/family needs, and find out ways to be involved and help out in our communities!

Silver Bay City Council Meeting, October 1, 2018

In attendance: Lana Fralich, city administrator, Tim Costley, city attorney, Shane Hoffman, Carlene Perfetto, Derrick Goutermont, Richard DeRosier, councilors, Scott Johnson, mayor.

North Shore Adventure Park owner Phil Huston was in attendance to discuss further development plans. The city EDA has worked over the past year to formulate a plan regarding the city property behind the Spur gas station. The decision has been made to move forward with having the property appraised, with the hope of closing on the sale of the property to NSA Park as soon as possible.

Huston said that he has two interested developers who want to start construction immediately and will be choosing one soon. He hopes to move forward with construction of the ropes course quickly, with plans to work through the winter and a June 2019 opening date. The motion to proceed with appraisals was approved.

Other city business included the setting of the truth in taxation meeting for December 3rd, approval of costs for staff training in biosolids land application, acceptance of confidential security position by Lisa Topp, and appointment of new confidential secretary Amanda Nelson.

Resolution 2018-34 regarding online payments for city services was passed. The new service will likely be available soon, with full capability by the first of next year. There will be no additional cost to the city, and individuals will be able to pay their city bills online using a credit card or debit card for a small fee. Resolution 2018-35 passed allowing part time police officer eligibility for PERA retirement fund.

2019 Health Insurance moved to a new plan at no additional cost to the city per team and employee request, allowing adjustment to lower deductible.

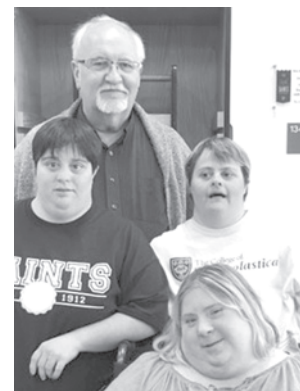
