- Made recommendation to Council to create new ordinance to help elevate issue.

Council referred issue to City Staff for code enforcement and business licensing violations.

- Made recommendation and reference to a possible city ordinance (trailer concealed behind fence) that would help the issue referenced by resident Mike Helmer.

Heather Funderbur made the following comments:

- Discussed concern about consistent vehicle speeding on 4700 W and 5100 W.
- Suggested additional 4-way stops, speed signals and/or speed bumps.
- Willing to fundraise for wanted improvements.

James Mann made the following comments:

- Concerned about speeding along newly paved 4700 W. roadway.

Council discussed with Weber County Sheriff Deputy Horton about solutions for speeding in these areas. Deputy Horton stated that the Sheriff's Department will continue to follow up and patrol.

Monica Mann made the following comments:

- Concerned about constant speeding along new 4700 W. roadway.
- Would like a permanent speed sign or speed bumps.

Shanna Bernard made the following comments:

- Would like Sheriff patrol along 4825 S.

James Mann made the following Comments:

- Did not believe that permanent signs are a adequate solution.

Heather Funderbur made the following comments:

- Would like to see permanent stop signs for public safety.
