## Copperstate 4 Wheelers Four Peaks Cleanup November 7, 2015

As a participant it is impossible to describe the enormous effort that this incredibly well organized 4x4 club made to ensure that this year's cleanup was an enormous success. CS4W's had porta-potties on site, four 30 yard dumpsters which were filled by the end of the day, a gigantic tent which provided shade and housed the registration table plus other tables laden with wonderful raffle prizes and treats for the volunteers.

There were also more tables for the lunch that the club dished out to the hungry cleanup gang of volunteers (over 300 of us, children and adults of all ages which included hot dogs, buns, potato salad, condiments, potato salad and a variety of cookies. CS4W held two raffles. The first raffle took place right after lunch and the second after the cleanup. The club also provided all of the 30 gallon trash bags as well as the cases of water for the cleanup crews.

There were twenty-two sites in pretty bad shape from shooters leaving all their trash behind which included paper and cardboard targets, old TVs, hot water heaters, propane tanks, chairs, mattresses, car seats, a zillion bottles and cans and all their empty shell casings I couldn't even lift my full bag of shotgun shells. Shame on them! The sad part of Copperstate's efforts is that they've been doing this for six years and the trash only seems to get worse each year.

CS4W provided their own trucks and trailers which went back and forth to each site picking up the huge bags of junk/stuff we collected. What a great group of four wheelers. It was amazing to see the difference after the sites had been cleared of debris. They were very pristine. It was difficult for us to understand why the forest service did not provide the garbage bags and at least the cases of water . It all came from Copperstate 4 Wheelers' own pockets.

The photos were gleaned from Copperstate 4 Wheelers' web-site (very nice website). We thank them all for their outstanding donations to help improve and save our public lands. It was an awesome effort.

The following comments from Phil Strittmatter, ASA4WDC Region II Director: "The forest service didn't chip in even a thin dime for the work we did to improve our land that they manage. But they seemed to have the funds to hire a crew of perhaps 15 or 20 plus materials and equipment to install miles of four-inch iron pipe fencing along the roads to keep us off of our land. "Go figure."

Collected 18 tons of trash Filled four 40 yard roll off dumpsters. Total: 36,000 pounds of garbage.

#### 2015

323 volunteers

Collected 21 tons of trash Filled four 40 yard roll off dumpsters. Total: 41,200 pounds of garbage.

Thank you to everybody who volunteered, participated, planned and contributed to this year's clean up efforts. The 323 volunteers who donated their time and energy to give back to their community accounted for approximately 2600 hours of volunteer service work.


