The deadline for the National Garden Club (NGC) President's Project Grant is 1 November 2017! This is a new NGC grant program for clubs entitled PLANT AMERICA. The purpose of the grant program is to provide financial support for new or existing club projects in their respective communities all across the United States. This fund will be a permanent fund with grants being given for each two-year administration. Individual garden clubs that are members of NGC may apply for funds up to \$1,000 for the direct expenses of projects. Recipients of grants will be notified, and all money will be awarded by 31 January 2018. Projects must be completed by June 2019. Final reports are due within two months after the completion of the project or by 1 July 2019.

Separately Liz Lester, Virginia Federation of Garden Club (VFGC) received information from Pat Wilson, chairman of the NGC Grant Committee, regarding the Espoma Products Grant. The total grant is \$5,000 worth of products. Espoma will decide based on the application a club sends in what the amount of products is needed for the project. So, the bottom line is more than 20 clubs may receive products for their project from Espoma! Plastic pollution and what to do about it

Pollution comes in many forms but I want to focus on the pollution that is caused by plastic products.

When we go to the grocery store almost everything we buy is wrapped in plastic or is sold in plastic containers or plastic bottles. We check out and carry our groceries home in huge amounts of one way plastic bags. If we are lucky we might be able to recycle some of the plastic bottles and plastic bags, if not we just dump everything in the garbage can and forget about what happens next.

Here are a few statistics:

- -33 million tons of plastic shopping bags are produced each year of which 8 million tons end up in the oceans.
- -By 2050 the combined weight of plastic in the oceans will exceed the weight of all the fish in the oceans.
- -There is an island of plastic in the Pacific Ocean ("The Great Pacific Garbage Patch") that is the size of Texas and another one is forming in the Atlantic Ocean.
- -100% of plastic has been produced since 1970, completely during our lifetime.

We could shrug our shoulders and say "so what" or we can raise awareness to this urgent pollution problem.

Here are some tips:

- 1. Bring your own reusable shopping bags and refuse to have anything put into plastic bags.
- 2. Buy beverages that are in glass, cardboard, or aluminum containers.
- 3. Recycle everything you can.
- 4. Reuse plastic containers at home
- 5. Buy eggs in cardboard boxes
- 6. Educate your family and friends
- 7. Support restaurants that use reusable plates and silverware.
- 8. Research everything that you can about the problem of pollution in the world to increase your knowledge and have an educated discussion with your family and friends.
- 9. Use Britta filters and your own reusable water bottles. Avoid buying bottled water at all costs!

Please get on board and start your new good habits today to help save our environment and our planet earth.
