### 2020 Commemorative Coin

Just a few short years from now, 2020 will be upon us, marking the 400th anniversary of the voyage of the *Mayflower* and the founding of Plymouth Colony. This is an exciting opportunity for the General Society of Mayflower Descendants to commemorate our Pilgrim ancestors and to share their inspirational story with the world.

To organize commemoration events and initiatives, GSMD has created a planning committee at the national level. Many of our 52 member societies are preparing for the 2020 Commemoration as well. GSMD's first 2020 initiative is to push for the United States Congress to pass an act directing the US Mint to issue a commemorative coin series recognizing key historical elements surrounding the Mayflower voyage and the establishment of Plymouth Colony.

We need 67 Senators and 287 Congress representatives to co-sponsor these bills. Whether you are a member of GSMD or not, whether you are a Pilgrim descendant or not, we are asking for your help to make this project a reality! Jane has been asked to run for Member-at -Large at the next General Congress. The minutes from the Annual meeting were published in the newsletter and approved by the Board of Assistants.



Governor Jane Schleinzer outlined the progress of the legislation authorizing a commemorative coin for the Mayflower year 2020 celebration, pointing out that we are still hoping to add sponsors, especially Illinois Congressmen and Senator Mark Kirk, to round out the sponsors list.

Deputy Governor John Schellinger reported that the November 19, 2016 Annual Meeting and luncheon will be held at the Allerton Center in Monticello.



### Valiant Ambition: George Washington, Benedict Arnold, and the Fate of the American Revolution

Book by Nathaniel Philbrick

"From the New York Times bestselling author of *In the Heart of the Sea* and *Mayflower* comes a surprising account of the middle years of the American Revolution, and the tragic relationship between George Washington and Benedict Arnold."

Readers are never disappointed when they open a Philbrick book seeking a well-researched peek behind the scenes of history's clichés, because they are always rewarded with a grand adventure in myth-busting. And this time the blinders are off for a clear look at the real battles of the American Revolution and the people who fought them. While the main characters are the Father of our Country, George Washington, and Benedict Arnold, a villain so vile his name has become synonymous with the term traitor, there are countless others profiled to show how people felt about the war.

The story begins in New York and New Jersey where the action moved after Bunker Hill. One of Philbrick's great strengths as an author is his ability to write clear, concise accounts of battles. In this he is greatly aided by some very well drawn battle maps. And there are battles! We join our rebel ancestors in the flight up through New Jersey, into and out of Manhattan Island. We cross the Delaware, survive the winter and Valley Forge, head to Upstate New York, then down to Pennsylvania. Fight, flee, fight, starve, fight, freeze, fight, until we return to the Hudson River for the final drama at West Point. Meanwhile, we meet the warm and generous British General William Howe whose restraint was based on his conviction that his troops were engaged in battle with their fellow countrymen, later replaced by British officers who were purely and simply out for fame and promotion.

Always the historian, Philbrick uses the words of others to illustrate his characters. It is the 20-year-old French officer, Lafayette, whose words paint the picture of "His Excellency" Washington as a truly nice man with his ego under control, whose "sense of right and wrong existed outside the impulsive demands of his own self-interest." Arnold's own letters paint him as pretty much of a loose cannon: resourceful and brave in battle, but a total Narcissist whose actions are driven by his distorted view that "whatever was best for him was, by definition, best for everyone else."

We learn some wonderful trivia. Who knew that Daniel Morgan's Virginia sharpshooters, armed with rifles, were able to pick off the officers of the Hessian troops one by one? That the Turtle, a diving-bell type device invented by David Bushnel, was the first submarine to be used here against an enemy? And many New England Colonists who had been holding back from the fight, changed their attitude when the Brits hired allied tribal warriors to join their ranks. Reminded by generations of bloody massacres, they hastened to enlist in their New England militias.

Philbrick, a Boston-born New Englander, points out an interesting divergence in attitudes towards the war. Rather than contrasting the New England Yankees with the Southern States Gentlemen, he contrasts all the Patriots, whose roots reach back to the early years in the original colonies, with the middle-settlement late-arrivers, who have little or no interest in forming an independent republic.

By the end of the book the reader shares Washington's shock and sadness when he learns that one of his trusted and admired young officers has betrayed him by attempting to sell the fortress on the Hudson River at West Point to the enemy. But the reader has some sympathies for a man, no matter how flawed, deep in debt with a beautiful young Loyalist wife, who nonetheless had sacrificed his health and fortune for the cause. After all, Arnold is not the only officer lacking in scruples, and Washington is not the only one driven by love of country.
