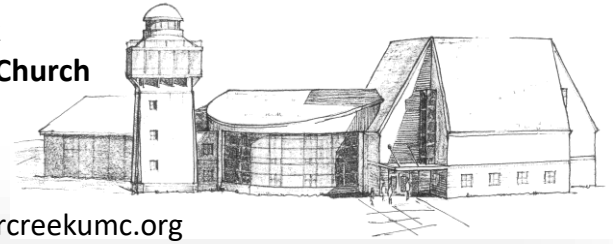
Healing Service – Our Lady of Mercy
