Some of you may have seen the "For Sale" sign on the land which can be accessed from Royal Ridge Drive between the Amberton Apartments and Grand Point Drive. It is 4.77 acres and extends to the back of the blue water tank owned by the San Antonio Water System (see photo on Page 2). A real estate broker contacted us and asked if the homeowner associations in Royal Ridge were interested in buying the land.

I emailed the presidents of our Home Owners Associations (HOAs), and after communicating with several individuals, we declined the offer to purchase the property. In addition to the problem of raising the money for the purchase, we were concerned about continuing upkeep, potential liability and the difficulty in limiting its use to residents of Royal Ridge. We all agreed that the best use would be for a park.

We suggested that the land be donated to the City and that the City explore establishing a park at that location. Because a "For Sale" sign is now on the land, it appears that the owners have decided that they are not interested in donating the land to the City.

Bob Robbins investigated and found that ten Grand Point and three Grand Haven homes (corner property excluded) back up to the vacant land. The property is zoned O-2 with permitted use as offices, parks and schools.

The homes backing up to the vacant land are in Royal Ridge I. Royal Ridge I has no existing homeowners association. I encourage the homeowners to organize to protect themselves; I can provide organizing help. Any commercial development will have less of an impact on the remainder of Royal Ridge, although Crown Ridge Townhomes may be impacted.

On a different topic, I recently drove through the development to our east on Weidner Road between Royal Ridge and the Jehovah's Witnesses Church. New Leaf Homes has seventeen homes that have been built or are under construction. The homes range in size from 1,660 to 3,028 sq. ft. Prices vary

from \$198,500 to \$279,500, or about \$111.76 per sq. ft. Their HOA dues will be about \$350.00 per year.

I received information from a realtor on recent sales in Royal Ridge. Sale prices range from \$88.90 to \$71.46 per sq. ft. The recent average sale price is \$84.14 per sq. ft.

You can obtain an approximate value for your property by looking at your most recent property tax statement, or, you can find the information at www.bcad.org. Go to property search and enter your (or the owner's) last name and then your first name. Use last year's search date – 2015. Click on the property address, and view details. Click on "Improvement/Building" and you will see the living area in square feet. Multiply the living area times \$84.14 to find an amount closer to the market value of your home. Our values are about 7% higher than the amounts listed by the Bexar appraisal district. But, if someone from the appraisal district reads this, the valuations are either absolutely correct or maybe a little high.

We can be reassured of the value of our homes and that our values are increasing. Even if they ever existed, construction problems in our homes have been remedied by prior or current homeowners. New home buyers can experience unexpected costly problems in the first few years of ownership – such as shifting foundations.

Let us continue to work to monitor and improve our neighborhood. If you can think of beneficial neighborhood projects, let me know. Have a safe summer!

# **ROYAL RIDGE CITIZENS ON PATROL**

As I said in the last issue, Royal Ridge Citizens on Patrol (RR COP) members continue their commitment to our collective security through daily patrols albeit we are fewer in number. I also thanked our neighbors who have taken the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) training to better prepare to call the SAPD on seeing criminal or suspicious activity. We appreciate each of you and your individual and collective efforts.

We do need additional new members though to continue providing the level of patrol coverage we have in the past. We are down to just over 30 active members and historically we have had 40 plus. As a result, several members are called on to patrol twice each month and of late, some three times. We have also had a couple of open dates over the past several months as I refuse to schedule anyone more than three times (previously two). Can we coax a few more of you to join us? There are over a thousand homes in the Royal Ridge neighborhoods and RR COP members come from less than 3% of them. Surely we see the need and can do better. RR COP needs you!

I don't expect the majority of neighbors have the time or desire to participate but I need to let

everyone know this program is no longer able to patrol at least two hours a day each day. If we don't have the coverage we had in the past, then I'd expect we will no longer enjoy the relatively low crime rate we presently experience. While we have a few residence and vehicle burglaries and thefts each month, daily crime reports indicate we are in a donut hole so to speak. There is a lot more going on around us. I attribute that hole to RR COP member patrols, concerned and involved neighbors' vigilance and reporting, and SAPD responses. We need more RR COP members though to keep the criminals plying their trade elsewhere.

By the time you read this the last opportunity for SAPD COP training will have passed until the fall. I will let you know that schedule in the June-July issue. In the meantime of course I will have reminded neighbors on our email list of any intervening and pop-up training opportunities. Please give serious thought to our need to improve our membership to be able to keep our crime rate at a minimum. Plan now to become involved!


