Based on input from our forum held in August, our Capital Campaign Committee is working to put together a proposal for a capital campaign to coincide with our church's 150th anniversary in 2018. In our 150th year, the campaign goal will be \$150,000, which will include some funds currently in hand. The "big ticket" item of the campaign will be the replacement of our parking lot. The proposal will include other maintenance and improvement items including new doors on the east side of the building, new carpeting in the lounge and library, and a welcoming awning for the north door on the east side of the building. We are also looking at the possibility of a rain garden to lessen storm water runoff.

You will receive more details of this proposal prior to our Budget Forum on October 29. At that forum, we will vote on whether to approve the proposal to enter into a capital campaign to fund these improvements. We will also vote on a draft budget for the 2018 church year.

The capital campaign would be separate and over and above our regular annual stewardship commitments. If the proposal is approved, the hope is that construction on the new parking lot would begin as soon as ISU classes end in spring 2018.

Be watching for more details. Information on the proposal will be available prior to the Budget Forum on October 29. If you have questions in the meantime, you may talk to one of the committee members: Barbara Woods, Wallace Sanders, Jere Maddux, Wes Johnson, and Pastor Dave; or Trustee chair John Anderson.

World Mission Offering

Through the month of October, we will receive the World Mission Offering, which supports American Baptist mission work around the world.



Our gifts help to support missionaries currently in the field and to train new missionaries for service. Our gifts help to build relationships with 240 global partners around the world. It is through these networks with Christian groups in other nations that our missionaries are invited to serve, and we work closely with these partners as we provide relief and disaster assistance.

Our church knows personally some of our mission personnel who work overseas. Dan Buttry has done amazing work in conflict transformation; this past year he has done significant work in Egypt, Lebanon, Sri Lanka, and other places. In November, he will be teaching at the seminary in Kiev, Ukraine.

Based in Amsterdam, Lauren Bethell fights human trafficking around the world. Her current work focuses on grassroots efforts to address exploitation and abuse of women and children.

David and Laura Parajon continue their amazing health ministry in Nicaragua, bringing medical care to rural areas as they train health promoters in very remote villages and establish health, hygiene, nutrition, and clean water projects.

Our gifts to the WMO support the work of these global servants and much more. We will receive this offering through the month of October, and invite you to give generously.

Relief for Puerto Rico





Our country has been battered repeatedly by natural disasters in recent weeks, the most recent being Hurricane Maria. which devastated the island of

Puerto Rico. We have now had three catastrophic events in a short period of time - which is not even including record wildfires in California, Montana, and other areas of the west. One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) funds have gone out from American Baptists to support relief efforts in Texas, Louisiana, Florida, and now Puerto Rico.

The American Baptist Churches of Puerto Rico is one of our stronger regions. Our 2011 biennial was held in San Juan. Our current president-elect, Josue Gomez-Menendez, is a layperson and attorney in San Juan, and the top church in our denomination in giving to United Mission is Primera Iglesia Bautista de Carolina in Carolina, PR.

American Baptist Home Mission Societies Executive Director Dr. Jeffrey Haggray has announced a multi-year initiative, "Rebuilding, Restoring, Renewing Puerto Rico." The effort seeks to raise \$1 million within the next three to six months through One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) to support rebuilding the homes. churches and lives of our brothers and sister in Christ.

"Within the next three to five years," Haggray said, "we will work with our American Baptist partners to restore all 114 churches and nine missions in the Iglesias Bautistas de Puerto Rico as well as Corporacion Milagros del Amor and Seminario Evangélico de Puerto Rico.

Our church receives the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering in June. These funds are disbursed as emergencies and natural disasters occur through the year. You may also give to OGHS throughout the year. If you would like to give specifically to assistance for Puerto Rico, you may write a check to the church with notation "OGHS-Puerto Rico." One hundred percent of gifts go to relief and rebuilding, as administrative costs are
