25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 24 September 2023 (Year A) "My Ways Are Above Your Ways – My Thoughts Are Above Your Thoughts."

The reading from the prophet Isaiah is part of a poem celebrating life as a gift from God. We are called to "seek the Lord" beyond the distractions and pressures of daily life and be active in our desire to know what God calls us to do. However, in doing so our presumptions about God might be challenged. We are prepared for this by God's words through the prophet, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor your ways my ways." Isaiah 55.

While no one knows the mind of God, God's wisdom conveyed through scripture in the challenging and comforting words of the prophets and through the mission of Jesus to bring the good news to the poor and the suffering of our world, has nurtured a faith in a God – as John put it who "IS LOVE, -universal in generosity, compassion and forgiveness towards all human beings, created in God's image and likeness: Such is the source of human dignity and respect to be shown towards each other.

Hence there is no "Godliness" in acts of violence, elitism, discrimination, exclusion or suppression or exploitation of the vulnerable. God offer of mercy and justice to all in a variety of ways is expressed and practised through the actions and caring hearts of those opened to perceive the love of God shining through the goodness, pains and needs of others and our world.

With these thoughts in mind the parable of today's Gospel reveals a different perspective to consider. Jesus tells a story which reverses some expectations we may have about worth in everyday life. Like most parables it is designed to stir us to "think again". The last to be hired to work get paid the same as those who have laboured all day for the land owner- what's more, the last is paid first. It certainly challenges our sense of justice and the concept of a "just wage" in the work place. But this is about the outrageous generosity of God which is not merited or bought but freely available to those most in need of it. One point to be drawn might be that God's generosity does no injustice, neither can it be calculated or earned. It does not depend on talent or staying power etc. The story is about people – human beings- getting what they need: all have a right to eat beyond a day, to provide for their families: to be welcomed, listened to and respected: to have a place they can call home.

Jesus through his life, teaching and through the care and selflessness of his followers invites us to see others as God sees them: unique, precious and to treat them accordingly.

In Matthew's view the standard of human behaviour towards each other is guided by nothing less than the perfect character of God – as in the mind of Christ Jesus. For us our challenge is and always will be to strive for the mind of Jesus who revealed the

generosity of God. How can we continue to grow as a genuine welcoming community responding to the people in our society who are most in need — newly arrived or long standing? First step? - letting go of prejudgements of others and for a while, by respectful listening - "walking in their shoes."

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Temporary Changes to weekday Masses


Fr Aloysius will be taking some leave from Tuesday 12 September to Wednesday 27 September.

Transforming Public Policies

Pope Francis' message for the Season of Creation notes that for the mighty river of peace and justice to continue flowing, we must transform the public policies that govern our societies and shape the lives of young people today and tomorrow. Economic policies that promote scandalous wealth for a privileged few and degrading conditions for many others, spell the end of peace and justice. It is clear that the richer nations have contracted an "ecological debt" that must be paid (cf. Laudato Si', 51)."

Pope Francis invites all people of good will to raise their voices to "halt this injustice towards the poor and towards our children, who will bear the worst effects of climate change". He implores world leaders who will gather for the UN Climate Change Conference (COP28) in Dubai later this year to listen to science and institute a rapid and equitable end to the era of fossil fuels. Let us pray:

Dear God, who loves the Earth, help humanity achieve climate justice. Put an end to excuses and exceptions, and bring repentance and acceptance of responsibility for damage to Earth's life, both past and urgently present. Amen

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his

bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.' The Gospel of the Lord.
