



### Apportionment Highlight: Our portion for the World Service Fund.

The <u>World Service Fund</u> is the heart of our denomination-wide ministry, underwriting Christian mission and ministry around the world. This fund strengthens our evangelism efforts, stimulates church growth, expands Bible studies and enriches spiritual commitment. By giving to the World Service Fund we help God's children everywhere shape the lives of tomorrow's leaders and proclaim our Christian faith. The <u>World Service Fund</u> truly demonstrates the Mission of the United Methodist Church by:

- Supporting specific local church work with children, youth, students, persons who are mentally and physically challenged, adults and older persons;
- Providing leadership and coordination for denominational ministry with youth;
- Continuing nearly 200 years of commitment to quality college and graduate education;
- Certifying United Methodist professional Christian educators, communicators and musicians;
- Assuring United Methodists speak and work to help encourage a more ethical, just and human world;
- Continuing a proud tradition of cooperation and dialogue with other faith traditions through interdenominational and ecumenical work;
- Giving our denomination a presence in the mass media and making new communications technologies accessible to the church.

## The Two-Part Pledge Card

At Cokesbury we make it a habit to pause and **give thanks** for the many blessings God has provided us. As an annual act of thanksgiving our members and friends designate a percentage or a specific amount of money that they intend to give in the coming year in support of our shared mission and ministry. We give thanks for those pledges and the faith that lies behind them! They are a sign of how we delight in being a part of God's work in the world!

In December regular attenders and members will receive **a two-part pledge card**. WHY should you complete one and turn it in? Evidence is great that when we commit actual figures (% or \$) we are more likely to recognize the value of our participation—and give GOD the glory. We know everything we have comes from God; a written commitment helps us to act on that conviction.

Part 1 invites you to support the **2018 Mission and Ministry** at Cokesbury. We are not asked to give to a randomly chosen goal; we fund the mission and ministry God calls us to undertake. As good stewards, we have a budget to keep track of expenses but as in any household surprises happen. We believe EVERYTHING needed—planned and unplanned— for the work will be provided by God through you. Mission and ministry for 2018 will provide the staff, programs, current facility operations and benevolent outreach to the larger church, local community and world family. We know we need to do a better job at reaching the unchurched and nominally Christian community—and that



takes resources beyond what we have been allocating. Our projected mission and ministry budget for 2018 is around \$270,000 to <u>BUILD CONNECTIONS</u> through nurture (worship & education), welcome and witness (media, evangelistic events), send and outreach (need-based mission & ministry), and equip (people & property) avenues.

Part 2 invites you to go "above and beyond" by supporting the <u>BUILD THE FUTURE</u> campaign. This three-year campaign (2018-20) will be a catalyst in furthering our mission and ministry by funding needed maintenance and renovations to the oldest parts of our campus. Right now, when a roof leaks or an air conditioner goes we have to meet that urgent need instead of funding important needs such as the renovation of the sanctuary and office bathrooms. If 100 people give \$10/week above their regular giving for the next three years we will have over \$150,000 for the improvements.

Commitment Saturday/Sunday is **December 16-17.** You will be invited to bring your pledge card forward at the end of worship that day. You may also submit your pledge to the church office. THANK YOU for continuing to make a kingdom difference through your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness through Cokesbury
