Jesus, the Messiah is Heaven come down to us. And now as the Apostle Paul writes in Hebrews 4:16 "Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

While we may not seek physical places in hopes of greater access to God, let us not forget in our struggles to remember that God is near and to come to Him boldly to receive His love and healing. Where in your life do you need a real encounter with heaven? The good news is that heaven has come, and His name is Jesus! Approach Him today with eager hearts because He is waiting to meet with you!

For Christians, Easter is not just one day - it's a season of 50 days, a week of weeks, derived in its length from the fifty days between Passover and Pentecost (which means fiftieth) in Judaism. Easter season begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends with <u>Pentecost</u>, the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church (see Acts 2).

Easter season is more than an extended celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. In the early church, Lent was a season when persons who wished to become Christians were learning how to live the way of Jesus and preparing for baptism on Easter Sunday. Christians have referred to this time of formation as "catechesis" or "echoing the way of Jesus." The original purpose of the Easter season was to continue the formation of new Christians in the faith. Christians have historically referred to this formation process as "mystagogy" or "leading people into the mysteries."

Today, this extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what we mean when we say Christ is risen and that we, as the church, are the body of the Risen Lord. It's a season for focusing on the core doctrines and mysteries of the faith and for preparing for the ministries the Spirit has empowered us to undertake in Jesus' name.

The season after Pentecost begins with Trinity Sunday and concludes with Christ the King/Reign of Christ Sunday. The purpose of this season is to support our common work of using the gifts we have been given in the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Because contexts for ministry can vary widely, the <u>lectionary readings</u> were chosen to permit more flexibility during this season. The three readings are not related to each other. Pastors and worship planners can create series that follow any one of the three different streams of texts (Old Testament, Epistle, or Gospel), whichever seems to be speaking into the missional context of the local church the best.

Thank you Church as we continue to support the efforts to care for those in need in Ukraine. Mission central recently received the following letter.

Dear Team at Mission Central,

I'm a British volunteer in Ukraine and yesterday my team and I took food and Humanitarian supplies into Bucha - to people who, as they told us, hadn't seen bread for 39 days. They have endured unimaginable things and their bravery was unbelievable. We checked every box in our van to see what was inside, to see what was needed where most, and so we came across your cards with your address on them.

I just thought you might like to know that your care packages have gone to one of the hardest hit places in Ukraine. Today we took the other half of them to villages north of Kyiv, who have been cut off from supplies for a long time.




