Dear Bruce and Jack

Tuesday, 27 April 2021

Through Peter Bothwell, I spoke today with the Organizing Regent of the Daughters of the American Revolution chapter here in Germany about possible cooperation in the future. We had a lovely conversation and there seems every good reason to presume that, whenever Corona allows it, we can be doing joint projects.

They have fond memories of the SAR trip to Germany several years ago. Also, I actually talked to some of their members in 2019 when we were all fondly thinking of a Germany Society trip to Germany. (But then came Corona.)

Our situation here is that we have basically a large handful of people scattered around a country almost the size of Ohio, Indiana and Illinois put together. This may mean that the events with all of our members will be exceedingly rare.

Still, if we can cooperate with the DAR, I would hope that any of our members who are within range of their events would represent the SAR at those events and vice versa. I think the appropriate term here is 'force multiplier'

I now have a newsletter ready to go out to our members but I have noticed that it contains some personal stories, so I am a little hesitant to put these out just as an email, since a couple of our members have expressed concerns about including personal information in such publications.

This raises the question of whether our Germany Society has a Facebook page. As I understand it, this lends some 'security' to our contents and might encourage our people to share information with other members such that it does not fall into the public domain. A reasonable precaution in these days of hacking and character assassination. If we have such a Facebook page, can you put me in touch with the person who runs the page?

The DAR Chapter here also has such a Facebook page and I expect to talk to their page manager in the next couple of days about the ins and outs of setting up such a Facebook page. Once I have that information, I will get back to you so that we can see what you want done in this matter. If however, at this point, you don't want a Facebook page, for whatever reason, please let me know ASAP.

I think I will hold off on the in-country newsletter for a couple more days until we have cleared this matter. (I attach the draft for your perusal before publishing.)

The other question is - what do we call the 'organizing committee', i.e., those who are working on getting things going here in-country? You wrote of 'Primary GERSSAR Leadership.' Could we make that simply 'In-Germany Organizing Committee'. I think that is very clear, including to the uninitiated.

People always like to know who they're dealing with, and it is always useful when communicating with outsiders to have a title that indicates that one has some authority. So, as I seem to be leading this, with your permission, I would like to call myself 'Chairman', In-Germany Organizing Committee`` or simply "Organizing Chairman". It has the appropriate heft and we don't have to identify anything further.
