Blast From the Past

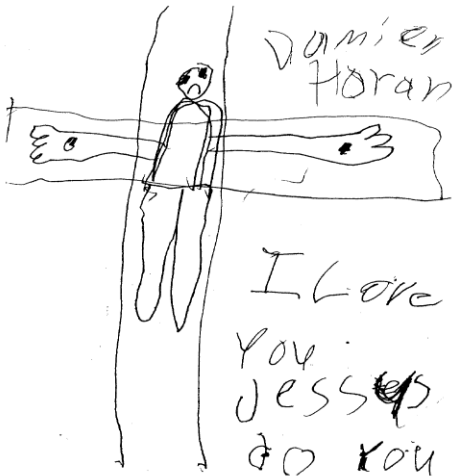
This week we are going to fast forward to the 1970s, to look at a fascinating and inspiring look at how the Catholic Church came together when the Freedom of Religion was being attacked. Madelyn Murray O'Hair was the founder of American Atheists and actively worked to remove any form of religious practice from public schools. She also tried to block St. Pope John Paul II from celebrating Mass at the Mall in Washington D.C. (She failed at this. The Court of Appeals stated that it violated not only the Pope's but also American Catholics' First Amendment rights to Freedom of Speech and Freedom of Religion). Mrs. O'Hair also tried to prevent radios and television stations from broadcasting anything related to religion. In the OLV parish bulletin from April 17, 1976, there was a call to the parishioners to sign a petition to prevent this from happening:

Madelyn Murray O'Hair, whose efforts successfully eliminated the use of Bible readings and prayers from all public schools, has been guaranteed a federal hearing in Washington D.C. on the subject of religion and airwaves by the Federal Communications Commission. This petition (No. RM 2493) would ultimately open the way to eliminate the proclamation of the Gospel via the airwaves of America. She took her petition bearing 27,000 signatures to back up her stand. If her attempt is successful, all Sunday worship services currently being broadcast, either by radio or television, would cease. Many elderly people and shut-ins depend on the radio or television to fulfill their worship needs every week as well as those recuperating from an illness or hospital visit. WHAT CAN WE DO????...

O'Hair did not succeed, and religious programming continues on stations to this day on channels like EWTN.
