

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING

November 7, 2018

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Grover Pryor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Holly Martinson, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Leo Pesch, Dave Sammons, and Erik Woog. Staff present: Police Chief Jamie Lucas and Interim Manager/Town Clerk Rhonda Shearer.

SAMMONS MOVED TO ACCEPT THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF OCTOBER 17, 2018. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM OCTOBER 18 THROUGH NOVEMBER 7, 2018 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$207,041.42. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED. SAMMONS SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The Mayor had no report.

The Police Chief reported:

- Between October 28 and October 29, there were a series of car burglaries that happened in Kremmling, Hot Sulphur Springs, and Granby. His department worked very hard, for many hours, and do have 2 suspects that have been arrested. They are working on getting a third suspect arrested as well.

There was no public works report.

There was no manager report.

Gary Bumgarner addressed the board, as he felt like that the town should be promoting new businesses to open, and having businesses go through a planning and zoning process to be able to operate seemed like the town is not promoting businesses well. Clerk Shearer noted that the specific use that was currently being applied for is a use by special review in the current code, and there is a process that must be followed. Trustee Woog felt that the Planning & Zoning Commission would have no issue with the request coming before them, but there is a process that must happen first.

Mayor Pryor presented Scott Spade with a retirement plaque and badge, for his years of service to the Town of Kremmling.

Chris Kruthaupt from Vector Disease Control was present at the meeting to discuss mosquito control. Our current contract ended this year, and the board would like to see if there is a better method to do mosquito control. After discussion, the town will send Mr. Kruthaupt a map with added larvicide application areas, and he will submit a new scope of work to the town, that will include added truck spraying options too. A one year contract was discussed to see how the new program works, before a longer contract is signed.

The board discussed a draft open/outdoor storage ordinance that was drafted by Clerk Shearer on behalf of the Planning & Zoning Commission. There was some discussion on the definitions that were used, but overall the board felt that the ordinance needed to have some public input, so a public hearing will be held at a later date.
