

Hovey & Frances Bullard Rock Rescue

Big news from the California beat with the tale of the Hovey Bullard Rock Rescue Caper!

Growing up, I remember my mother telling me about the amazing rock and cactus garden Hovey and Frances Bullard had in California in the 20s. We got a glimpse of that from the movies my grandparents, John E. Rice and Helen Ellis Rice, made when they visited California during that time. When Hovey's son, John Anson Bullard, moved to Beverly Hills, he took many of the rocks and cacti with him.



Originally a black-and-white photo of Hovey's cactus/rock garden overlooking Echo Park Lake in Los Angeles, it was hand-colored by his wife Frances.

The rocks are special because Hovey, Frances, and a young John Anson frequently drove into the California desert around the turn of the century and hand-picked the many volcanic and mineral rocks to bring home.



Andy Alison, grandson of John Anson and great grandson of Hovey, got wind that the old Bullard house in Beverly Hills had been sold and was being renovat-

ed. So,

last fall, he asked the new owners if they'd be interested in trading old family photos of the Bullard Home for some of the strange rocks and boulders. His wish was granted, and he and his wife, Natalie, loaded the rocks into a U-haul and brought them to their home in Laguna







Beach. Natalie is a marvelous gardener who shares Frances Bullard's passion for growing succulents. She has arranged the rocks into a meandering garden path like Hovey and Frances' garden at Echo Park.

It's incredible how a little bit of Bullard history and a few old photos helped bring these special desert rocks back into the Bullard fold to create a new "Bullard Succulent Garden" for the family to once again enjoy a century later.

Background notes (provided by Andy Allison):

- FRANCES BULLARD I think it is only fair that we include Hovey's wife Frances Bullard into the title and story, as she was a highly recognized horticulturist in her day and one primarily responsible for creating the Bullard Garden at the Echo Park residence on an adjacent lot next to the home between 1903 and 1933. Frances always traveled with Hovey and quite often you John Anson on every auto adventure leading the way into the desert to collect specimen cacti, rocks, soil, etc.
- <u>TRADING PHOTOS FOR THE ROCKS</u> We bartered with the contractor and new owners of the Beverly Hills home for the desert rocks and boulders by trading historic photos of the Bullard Home that I scanned from Johnnie and Lucile Bullard's photo albums. Click on the link below to view the

The lunch she served included delicious salad and sandwiches, followed by a very tasty birthday cake accompanied by the singing of a joyous "Happy Birthday" to Hovey. Durinda's home is an absolutely beautiful classic 1920s Hollywood Bungalow that she has decorated with the most amazing collectibles.

John, Barbara, and Andy had a lot of fun that morning driving together from Anaheim to Durinda's home in Los Angeles. Thanks to

Barb's excellent navigation, they were able to arrive on time, despite the usual L.A. traffic. During their road trip they talked about growing up as cousins, shared memories about their Bullard parents and grandparents, previous family gatherings, and where on the West Coast and in Arizo-



na their other siblings are now residing.

The California cousins had so much fun spending the afternoon exploring the Forest Lawn Grand Mausoleum where the Bullard, Schmidt* and Alison family crypts are located. Forest Lawn Cemetery is huge and the

Durinda placed nearly a year ago was still there

room, sharing their thoughts and stories, just as their Bullard ancestors had 100 years before at the home of Hovey and Frances Bullard in Echo Park. When asked, we all felt the presence of Hovey, Frances, and Hattie celebrating with them in spirit, consciously enjoying the simple gathering to share their Bullard legacy, Hovey's birthday, and creating new family memories of our own.
