Staff Reports:

PARK: Park manager, Ron Fjerkenstad, reported on park activities:

- Experiencing minor problems with the old Toro mower and may need to replace in 2020.
- Will need to get a quote for crushed granite for top of hill on driveway as it is still very muddy.
- The cart was repaired and working well. They had to use a rental until it was fixed.
- Discussed the need to increase park fees for 2020.
- Park sites are pretty much full thru labor-day weekend and seven in the overflow.
- Labor-day weekend they start taking written requests for seasonal spots for 2020.
- The mower ran into the bottom piece of the slide-out on the Teigland camper. They are getting quotes for repair

DRAINAGE MANAGER/INSPECTOR: Jared Roiland reported on monthly activities.

- Held an informational landowner meeting on County Ditch #4 on July 15, 2019.
- Attended an informational FEMA meeting to discuss documentation we needed to supply for disaster relief funding.
- Attended the viewer's seminar at the U of M Southwest Research Facility in Lamberton, MN on July 18th, 2019.
- Met with MN Valley COOP on site in Riverside Township to discuss how to handle flooding issues on the township road and sub-station.
- Dragonfly View Drone Service flew a portion of County Ditch #3 and showed us the capability of a drone and all the different tools and applications for a drone.
- Met with NRCS to inspect the Canby Creek dams on July 17, 2019.
- Mailed a survey to landowners on CD #24 and returned them to Houston Engineering.
- Continue to update information in Drainage DB.

COORDINATOR: Coordinator Mitch Enderson reported on monthly activities.

- The Drainage Records Modernization Grant reimbursement & budget were submitted for April June, 2019.
- We will start to scan the large maps using the County KIP scanner.
- The WRAPS reimbursement for April-June was submitted and approved.
- The WRAPS semi-annual report for Jan-June 2019 was submitted and approved.
- We will be holding a Family Fun event at Del Clark on June 19th (3-7 p.m.). Games and educational packets & booths will be set up.
- Hosted a local partners WRAPS meeting with Houston Engineering to overview what they are currently working on with SAMS modeling to set up priority tables.
- Have had nine SSTS applications submitted and approved this year.
- The SSTS semi-annual report and budget was submitted and approved.
- Trudy & I attended the Area II meeting on July 11th, 2019.

- Trudy, Jared, & I joined in on the NRCS Canby Creek Dam Inspections held July 17, 2019.
- DNR will be back out to go over the survey results of the potential Florida Creek reroute to its natural channel on August 21, 2019.
- Asked for permission to hold a photo contest again this year. The Board gave approval.
- Hopefully will be working on the Canby Creek grant sites this fall. Yellow Medicine SWCD has heard from some landowners interested in potential storage project sites in close proximity of Canby Creek with project funds.

WCA - Coordinator Mitch Enderson:

- It was another busy month reviewing drainage permits for WCA this month. Multiple permits needed setbacks, other restrictions, or guidance.
- Some landowners have inquired about credit earning potential through wetland restorations.
- I have been working with Riverside Township & Minnesota Valley Coop to work on a solution to protect a substation but not violate WCA.
- I am working with a landowner to find a solution for cattle crossing without having wetland impacts.
- I was asked by a landowner about deepening a current wetland and using as recycled irrigation.
- The Wetland delineator program is being relinquished by U of M and being overtaken by BWSR. I will need to still submit my continuing education form but the fee is being waived.

Hastad presented meeting minutes #593 for approval.

Administrator Report/Old & New Business:

- Discussed the DNR dam inspections. Discussed fencing on R-6 to keep cattle off the face of the dam and some
 minor work that needed to be done on the Canby Creek dams. Hastad will contact someone for quote on the
 fencing work.
- Beatles were put on R-6 dam to help control leafy spurge.
- Reported legislation changed stating that the manager per diem can be \$125 per day. Previous it was \$75/day. If the manager's wish to make this change it needs to be in the minutes and policies.
- Reviewed the 2019 budget and current costs, and then discussed the 2020 budget.

M/S/P to set the proposed 2020 levy at \$250,000 with additional project expense at \$40,000 for a total budget of \$290,000.

Discussed the renewal of the USGS Yellow Bank Stream Gauge funding request.

- Hastad reviewed the revisions to the Park Rules. Manager Craigmile commented that something should be in the
 rules regarding parking by the boat launch as some people tend to park their vehicle and boat trailer in such a way
 as it blocks access to the boat launch. Hastad will make adjustment to the park rules and bring back to the board
 for amendment approval of the rules.
- Discussed quotes for a side-by-side. Manager Ludvigson will check on this and bring back to the Board.
- Reviewed a request from Dan Aakre for tree snagging in section 17, Garfield Township. This area is crucial to clean as the trees will plug the bridge.

M/S/P to contribute \$2500 to clean trees in section 17, Garfield Township.

• Discussed letter of support to MAWD supporting an Administrative Levy Increase. Board felt this was a good idea.

OTHERS:

A group of landowners, township officials, & two Commissioners from Yellow Medicine, & one from Lincoln County met with the Board to address flooding issues East and North of Canby on the Lac qui Parle River. The river is partially silted in wrecking roads & private property also due to cross-over flooding issues. The Watershed Board discussed the need for a large retention structure, similar to Lazarus Creek dam, but on the Lac qui Parle River and reported they have been trying to get funding for this in the past. A few year ago the Watershed had a bill for funding for an engineer study for this and it was heard before the Senate Committee but it wasn't heard in the house. The Watershed Board said they would pursue funding again and would appreciate letters of support from the Townships, Counties, and local citizens.

This group also discussed concerns with the Upper Deer Creek Dam structure located upstream of Lake Hendricks in South Dakota. Discussion followed. The group formed a committee consisting of Yellow Medicine Commissioners Ron Antony & Glenn Kack, Lincoln County Commissioner Joe Drietz, David Swenson, David Beecher, Mike Beecher, Tim Miller, & LQP-YB Watershed Manager David Craigmile. Hastad will organize a meeting with the Committee and the Brookings & Deuel Conservation Services to discuss maintenance, & inspection of the structure.

Chuck Hoffman motioned to accept the above committee, seconded by Tim Miller. Commissioner Ron Antony called for a vote, and the motion unanimously passed.

Freeland Township Board of Dennis Koenig, Rodney Hanson, DeWayne Swenson, & Justin Koenig met with the Board to discuss water concerns in Section 28 & 33 of Freeland Township. The Township is getting cross over flooding from Florida creek and Lazarus creek and it has washed out a dike that was put in by local farmers in 1969. They discussed how to get help and dollars to repair the private dike. Manager Ellefson discussed having the Freeland Township Board discuss with FEMA and see if there would be any funding help. This group also discussed the need for smaller structures on the tributaries to Florida creek. The Board discussed maybe discussing with Area II.

Paul Wymar met with the Board regarding a neighbor that put in a series of 638's that outletted through his property to the creek. They also cleaned about 150' of the private ditch without his permission. The Watershed Board was aware of this and were working with Mr. Dejong for an after-the-fact permit according to the Watershed rules. Mr. Wymar felt the project was environmentally sound but wants some compensation for the outlet on his property. Mr. Wymar shared a SWCD designed project for his property and has been approved cost-share for the project. The Board thought it was a good project and would sign a Watershed permit if he decided to follow through with the project on his property.

Jan Oellien met with the Board to inquire about getting LiDar maps of the Watershed near her property in Garfield Township. The Board informed her she could get this information in the Watershed Office during working hours.
