

On June 6th, we celebrated fourth anniversary at The Lord's Café. It is hard to believe the number of lunches and prayers provided for those in our community. God has provided the volunteers and food to always keep the doors open. The Lord's Café is a place of hope and refuge. We have seen many changes in individuals and the facility.

This summer provided to be very busy again. We averaged about 250 lunches a day. God continued stretch my faith leading The Lord's Café team this summer. I am very thankful Gina helped me come up with creative menu options when the freezers were low of food. Each day, we seemed to have enough food for all those who came to eat. This summer, more of our faith family helped throughout the summer. It was great to see our faith family involved with community but also the mission teams.

God provided a hair and nail salon. The salon building provides a place for hair stylist to come share the gospel. The building is complete with running hot water and electricity. Throughout the summer various mission teams provided the resources and labor to get this new ministry building operational.

The ministry closets continue to be used not only in the summer months, but year round. We have an ongoing need for baby care and adult care items. We continually give away baby diapers, wipes, adult diapers, and other adult care items. In addition, the clothing porch is a very active place when new shipments of cloths arrive.

Day Camp

We were excited to see Day Camp grow this year! Over eighty children were registered for Day Camp. Thankfully, not all the children came on the same day because each day was full of adventure. When the Gospel is spoken in conversation, expect spiritual battles from the evil one. The goal for Day Camp is the Gospel.

Again this year, the evil one continued to cause distractions. His influence came out through a couple of the children. We are thankful for the power of prayer and for leadership aware of spiritual battles. We are the most thankful for having victory through the blood of Jesus Christ! As the evil one attempted to cause distraction, victories were won! Several children placed their faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior.

The mission teams provided Bible lessons, worship, crafts, and recreation. Most Mondays started out with the children pushing their limits; by Thursday, tears flowed as good byes were said. Day Camp ran for ten weeks this summer. Through the course of the summer, over seventy Bible lessons were taught. Each day the children engaged in two times of musical worship.



The Learning Center

This summer much work was accomplished on The Learning Center. The youth room is now complete with new lights, paint, drop ceiling, and HCVA. A play ground has been added in the back of the building. The hallways near the mission dorms have been repainted. The worship area walls are complete up the roof line and painted. We also have a new stage!

In just a few short days, work is scheduled to install the long awaited pump station! Once this equipment is installed, the shower room will be completely operational! We are so thankful for everyone who has given resources, time, and energy to get The Learning Center from a dream to reality. "Grateful" is the one word to describe the summer team from UC. This summer, UC provided six college students the opportunity to come dive in missions with Crossroads Community. This allowed us to have extra help for each area of ministry. During the summer, each team member worked in various areas of ministry to see God at work.

The UC team went above and beyond to help make this summer flow as smooth as possible. These six students sacrificed their summer and comforts of home to come follow God's calling. Our family had the privilege of hosting the UC team for lunch, laundry, and staff meeting each Sunday. We know God has incredible plans for these group! With all the twist and turns from mission teams and our family life, the UC team was essential!

Laundry

Laundry ministry provides loads of opportunities for the teams to share the Gospel. This year, the owners of the laundry mat opened their business an hour early each Tuesday and Thursday. During laundry ministry, anyone in community can bring an unlimited amount of dirty clothing. Obviously, laundry ministry is not about dirty clothing, as each customer's clothes are being washed, the Gospel is shared. This summer, many came in to faith with Christ as Lord and Savior. In addition, many people were able to experience the love of Christ which met them at the point of need.

Mission team members provided the laundry detergent and quarters for each person. Each night at debrief following laundry ministry days, many shared their experiences of sharing their faith. For some younger team members, learning to wash clothes was an adventure. Many also experienced humility handling others underwear and other dirty clothes.



One particular customer brought six months' worth of dirty laundry the first day of summer. It is easier for many people in our county to find free clothing instead of spending money to wash laundry. Some of the customers during the summer were surprised to have their clothes washed for free. Laundry ministry is a simple way to love people while taking care of a basic need.

Upcoming Opportunities

Missions does not end when the last summer mission leaves. God continues to provide mission teams to come throughout the year to help. This fall is shaping up to a great time to connect with missions! We welcome our first team from Louisiana in just a few short days. In addition, almost every week of October we will welcome teams. Of course, we are planning on the Community Thanksgiving Dinner and Christmas outreach event.

Ongoing ministries will look a little different this fall. The Lord's Café will be open for lunch and food give away on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. We will have a few breaks for holidays, travel, and weather. This year, we are cutting back on After School @ The Learning Center. We will only be open on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We are making this adjustment because we need more volunteers. This will also free up our family to focus more time on our school.

October The Fall Coat Giveaway will be held on Saturday, October 24. We have already begun collecting coats, hoodies, gloves, scarfs, and hats. Last year, over 1,200 coats were given away during the winter months. We expect to have the same need again this season. Before the event, we will be collecting all the winter items. It takes quite a bit of effort to sort and prepare for the giveaway day. On the day of the event, volunteers become personal shoppers and evangelist. The day of the coat giveaway is an exciting days to meet community and to see God meeting the basic need of warmth. Be involved with donations and serving! November On Saturday, November 21, we will host our annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner. We will have limited numbers of volunteers. There will be a sign up on our website for any group or individual wanting to come serve (CrossroadsCommunityBC.org). This year, we are looking for donations to help cover the cost of the meal. We do expect to exceed last year's meal serving 1,162.

December We are planning our Christmas Backpack Outreach. Our target goal is the first weekend in December. We are still making plans now for this event. We are expecting between 800 and 1,000 backpacks this year.
