## **Timeline**

- 1513 Spanish explorer Ponce de Leon makes first contact with Native Americans in what is today Florida
- 1845 Florida becomes the 27<sup>th</sup> state
- 1878 Hullam Jones invents the first glass bottom boat in Silver Springs
- 1888 Henry Flagler opens the Hotel Ponce de León, first in a series of luxury resorts along Florida's east coast
- 1893 St. Augustine Alligator Farm opens
- 1929 Edward Bok builds Bok Tower
- 1936 Cypress Gardens opens (closes 2006). Parrot Jungle (today Jungle Island) opens
- 1938 Marine Studios (later Marineland) opens. It will pioneer dolphin shows in the early 1950s
- 1947 Everglades National Park is dedicated. First mermaid shows at Weeki Wachee Springs
- 1956 Florida Citrus Tower opens. The Federal-Aid Highway Act establishes the Interstate Highway System
- 1971 Walt Disney World opens in Orlando
- 2022 Florida welcomes a record 137.6 million visitors
