Father Hearn will continue to celebrate weekday Masses privately with intentions from our Mass book (as per the bulletin) and he is available if needed for personal pastoral care of parishioners.

ORDINARY TIME

Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday; the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays in Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". Pope Paul VI, in his Apostolic Letter approving the Roman calendar (February 14, 1969) says, "The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year." The Sundays in Ordinary Time are an important part of this unfolding mystery.

Sunday's Theme

Today we conclude the Fifty Great Days of Easter with the Solemnity of Pentecost. As Christians, we celebrate Pentecost as the birthday of the Christian Church because it is the day that the disciples received an outpouring of the Holy Spirit and were empowered to begin to share the good news with others. In the First Reading we hear that "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place" and that "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability". Today too, across the world, a myriad of voices, different languages, and many cultural expressions celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. Let us join our voices with that universal Pentecost chorus.



The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are **wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.**



The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated with Mass on Wednesday, June 15th at 7:00 p.m. All parishioners are welcome.

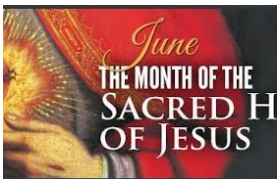
FOR YOUR INFORMATION DIOCESAN STIPENDS

BAPTISM STIPEND - \$25.00 - Baptisms are celebrated by appointment (after a Baptism Preparation Course has been completed).

BAPTISM PREPARATION: The baptism of a child is a very important event in the life of the child, the child's family, and the parish community. To help parents enter more fully into the celebration of their child's baptism, St. Joseph's Parish offers a Baptism Preparation Course by appointment. Parents along with godparents are expected to attend the Baptism Preparation Course before the baptism of the child. Please call the Parish Office to register.

MARRIAGE STIPEND - \$200.00 - Please allow at least six months between the time of contacting the Parish and the date of the Marriage. A Marriage Preparation Course is required.

FUNERAL STIPEND - \$200.00 - St. Joseph's Parish has a Bereavement Committee which will contact you to coordinate the funeral services.



The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart. Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term "Sacred Heart of Jesus" denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essential: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind. The "Sacred Heart" is Christ, the Word Incarnate, Saviour, intrinsically containing, in the Spirit, an infinite divine-human love for the Father and for his brothers. Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a wonderful historical expression of the Church's piety for Christ, her Spouse and Lord: it calls for a fundamental attitude of conversion and reparation, of love and gratitude, apostolic commitment and dedication to Christ and his saving work.

A short Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart

*Sacred Heart of Jesus, filled with infinite love,
broken by my ingratitude, pierced by my sins,
yet loving me still, accept the consecration which I make to you,
of all that I am and all that I have.
Take every faculty of my soul and body,
and draw me, day by day, nearer and nearer to your sacred side:
There, as I can hear the lesson, teach me your blessed ways. Amen*

The parish also offers direct deposit for contributions. 2022 envelopes are available at the Office. Income Tax Receipts for 2021 are also available.

The 2021-2022 Living with Christ Sunday Missal is available at the Parish Office for \$5.00 each. The Sunday Missal contains complete readings and Mass texts, as well as selected hymns for Sundays and feast days for the entire Church year.

JUNE 6 - MEMORIAL OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH: The title honouring Mary as "Mother of the Church" is used "in the texts of spiritual authors as well as in the Magisterium of Popes Benedict XIV and Leo XIII" (*Decree of Pope Francis, February 11, 2018*). During the Second Vatican Council, the title "Mother of the Church" was bestowed on the Blessed Virgin Mary by Pope Paul VI who declared that "the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this tenderest of titles". Most recently, on February 11, 2018, the 160th anniversary of the apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Lourdes, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, decreed that "the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, should be inscribed in the Roman Calendar on the Monday following Pentecost and be now celebrated every year. This celebration will help us to remember that growth in the Christian life must be anchored to the Mystery of the Cross, to the oblation of Christ in the Eucharistic Banquet and the Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the Redeemed, the Virgin who makes her offering to God". This Memorial takes precedence over other memorials which may fall on the same day.

JUNE 11 - MEMORIAL OF ST. BARNABAS, APOSTLE: Barnabas, a Jew from Cyprus, came to Jerusalem where he joined the early Christian community. The apostles changed his name from Joseph to Barnabas which Saint Luke tells us means 'man of encouragement'. All that we know of Barnabas is recorded by Saint Luke in the *Acts of the Apostles*: he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. It was Barnabas who accepted Paul into the community after his conversion and who was at Paul's side for many years as his partner in evangelizing the Gentiles. Tradition has it that Barnabas was stoned to death in his native Cyprus about the year 61.
