Peace By The Cross

It has been said of Europe, that it is a great jig saw puzzle with one PEACE missing. And as I sit here to write, it occurs to me; is this not a world condition? Yes, surely there is something — one thing—a piece missing from this puzzled world. Could that piece be the "Old Rugged Cross" that has been so despised by the world. In Col. 1:20 we read, "And having made peace through the blood of his cross, by him to reconcile all things unto himself; by him, I say, whether they be things in earth, or things in heaven." The cross of Christ has been rejected by the world. Jesus came to his own but they received him not. and for more than nineten centuries now the world has had a privilege of accepting. A few have, but largely he has been rejected. Paul the Apostle has said that the preaching of the cross is, to them that perish, foolishness.

Only a few weeks ago a carefully documented thirty page petition was presented to the Israeli Government, asking it to exonerate Christ: but Dr. Felix Rosenblueth, Israel's Minister of Justice, said he saw no legal ground to justify an appeal. So has not only the new nation of Israel again denied the legality of Jesus as the Christ, his cross, with its blood efficacious for all human sins and diseases; but the nations of the world have turned a deaf ear to the gospel of God's Son. The United Nations have persistently refused the intervention of prayer. I understand that just recently it is planned that a prayer room is to be built on the U.N. assembly building. But to date where have we gotten toward a world peace? It has been stated that the nations forming the Atlantic Charter have never once opened their sessions with prayer. (The excuse with the U.N. was that nations present were opposed to prayer. What about the nations forming the Atlantic Charter? Where is peace? "Ye shall hear of wars and rumors of wars, be not terrified, the end is

not yet."

The world is preparing itself for the greatest devastating epoch it will ever know. With the power of atomic energy coming into use, and science delving and discovering in fields that God has reserved for Himself alone. It is a true saying that fools rush in, where Angels fear to tread. Science is today on the verge of discovering the germ of life, it is said that potentially life already exists in the scientist's test tube. This is leading us up to the facts stated in Rev. 13, when the False Prophet will give life to the image of the Beast that closes the Age. earth's suffering, its apex pointin to God's heaven and its cross arm reaching for every human soul an searching to meet its need. Is any wonder Peter the Apostl preached Peace to the Gentiles, b the Man that hung on it. "For H is our Peace." Science, educatior billions in cold rolled steel in pre paredness for war, industry or an accomplishment of man will neve fit into the place of the Christ c the cross; nor can Peace that flow like a river ever be witnessed unt we are willing to come to His feet confess our sins and take up ou cross daily and follow Him.

Men may bicker, debate bargain with, and then again strik at their superiors. This life even at its best is very hort and we are soon cut off and re gone to man's LONG HOME. Dur lives are frail and OUR DAYS ARE LIKE A SHADOW THAT DECLINETH.

Life, and its success or failure will be determined by the way we ach build with the material that God gives at our disposal to use. t is a wonderful blessing in itself o think that God is so kind and nerciful to remember us and give is life and grace to build an upight, pure and honorable house of our lives to be used as a channel of blessing to the souls of men.

There are many lines of trades and arts that we might be able to bursue in this life and obtain profit and gain. Gain in goods of this world are a blessing when used as a benefit and help to our fellowman. But, if used selfishly and without the approval of God over them they will bring damnation and sorrow to our lives.

Let us take a look at the lives of our ten leading financiers of our nation in the year of 1923. A very important meeting was called at the Edgewater Beach Hotel in Chicago. Attending this meeting were the ten leading men of the money world. Charles Schwab, president of the largest independent steel company; Sam Insull, president of the greatest utility company; Arthur Sutton, greatest wheat speculator; Howard Hopson, president of the largest gas company; Richard Whitney, presiden of the New York Stock Exchange; Jesse Livermore, the greatest "bear" on Wall Street: Albert Fall, member of the President's Cabinet; Iver Krueger, head of the greatest monopoly; and Leon Frazer, president of the Bank of International Settlements. Think of these men with all their wealth and prestige and authority. As the world saw them they were surely wizards and men of success. But let us look at these same men twenty-five years later. Schwab, died a bankrupt and lived on borrowed money for five years before his death. Insull, died a fugitive from justice in a foreign land without a cent. Sutton died abroad insolvent; Hopson is now insane; Whitney was recently released from Sing Sing Penitentiary. Fall was released from prison so he could die at home. Livermore, Krueger and Frazer, all committed suicide.

This is the story of men who were seemingly successful in making money but never learned how to make a life. They didn't know of what life consisted. They failed to lay the right foundation and their houses were as houses built upon the sand. Their houses fell and great was the fall thereof.

Life and its success or failure is the most important issue that we face today. Success can be accomplished if we take the right foundation and then build thereon.

We shall endeavor to mention a few concrete examples of men who have taken Christ as their guide and what men can be and do if God's Holy Book and its teachings are consistently a part of their lives.

Mr. Kimball of Boston met a young lad in the rear of a shoe store. He talked to the boy about Christ and making a decision to begin a life of service. The boy was influenced and his life was changed. This boy was Dwight L. Moody, the Lord's servant, who won untold thousands to Christ and raised a million dollars for church and charitable purposes.

A Sunday School teacher taught a 15 year old boy the teachings of Jesus in her Sunday School class. He was won to the Lord and that boy was Charles Spurgeon, the world's greatest Baptist preacher.

In the hill country of Vermont a Mrs. H. F. Renolds noticed a boy in her Sunday School class one morning squirming and twisting and unconcerned. By the help of the Lord she was able to teach him two things; first, to be a Christian man; second, to remember the Sabbath Day and keep it Holy. This unconcerned boy was Calvin Coolige, who became President of the United States.

So, our thought of success or failure of life is proven to be in our choosing and our own selection. It is said that "it takes eight pounds of steel to make an axe, but eight pounds of steel is not an axe." It takes melting, pouring, shaping, sharpening and polishing to make life what it should be in order that we be a servant and a vessel in the Lord's service.

In Isaiah 28:16, we find a portion of scripture recording these words: "Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone a sure foundation." If we take Christ and His teachings as the foundation for our lives we will be successful in this life and in the life to come. If we leave the Christ out of our lives we are "As He That Beateth The Air" . . .



Jesus Saves

We are going to use for our text, Matt. 1:21. "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins."

The first thing we see is that Jesus came to SAVE. We read in Matt. 18:11, "For the Son of man is come to save that which was lost." Jesus was not born to be an earthly king as the Jewish people of that day thought, but He came to SAVE that which was lost. Jesus left His home in heaven just to save people from their sins, so they could have everlasting life. For John 3:16 tells us, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.'

Jesus came for one purpose, that was to save. Should there have been only one person in the world that had sinned, Jesus would have come to save that one sinner. We read in Luke 9:56, "For the Son of man is not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them." And in Matt. 18:12, "How think ye? If a man have an hundred sheep, and one of them be gone astray, doth he not leave the ninety and nine, and goeth into the mountains, and seeketh that which is gone astray?"

Jesus would have given His life for just you, or for me, if we had been the only sinners in the world. He left His home in heaven for a while, to suffer for our sins. He came in the form of a babe, born in a manger, and grew up like all boys of that time. When He reached the age of thirty years, He began to tell the world about the love of God, and that He was the Son of God, sent to save men from their sins. But most of the people would not believe. After three and a half years of ministry Jesus was crucified on a cross, made by men He came to save.

We see also, that Jesus came to save ALL men. In Luke 19:10 we read, "For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that

which was lost." That takes in everyone, because everyone is lost until they give their hearts to Jesus, then life begins. We are all born in sin, therefore we are all lost. There is no hope in ourselves, just death. Jesus is always seeking the lost ones though, and in every one's lifetime, whoever it might be, that person has heard, (or will hear), the voice of Jesus. Some have heard, and obeyed the call, and have been saved from their sins, and the wrath of God: while others have heard and not listened to the voice of Jesus, and have gone their own way like a foolish lamb, until it is too late to turn back—because its too hard to do. They have gone too far in sin and they cannot give the devil up, and the devil surely won't give anyone back to God. Yes. I believe that Jesus has called, and will call everyone until the end. The question is, do we listen to that call. when He calls us to be saved, to be sanctified, to be baptized with the Holy Spirit; or do we just say some other time, or I don't feel like it right now. We can never please God if we don't obey Him when He calls, or when He tells us to do something. Jesus wants to save us completely.

Again we read in John 3:17 and 12:47 that Jesus came to save the WORLD. John 3:17 reads "For God sent not His Son into the world to condemn the world: but that the world through Him might be saved." John 12:47, "And if any man hear my words, and believe not, I judge him not: for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world." At the present time Jesus is our Saviour, and He would that all men would be saved, and have life. There is coming a time though when He will be a Judge, at the "Judgment Day," when all men shall be judged, when every knee shall bow, when every tongue shall confess. Jesus wants every person in the world to be saved. He came to save all that would believe, and follow Him.

RELIGION BY TELEVISION

Blazing a trail that other evangelicals have only talked about, Jack Wyrtzen early in April began regular Saturday evening telecasts of his Word of Life Hour. The half-hour program is released at 8:00 p. m. by Station WATV on channel 13.

A month earlier Wyrtzen had experimented with the television from Newark's Mosque Theater. Then he began to study television in earnest, decided it "presents the greatest open door we have ever had for preaching the gospel."

Wyrtzen's potential audience in the compact New York area amounts to 13½ million people, and already there are 800,000 television sets in use.

If the program continues to click, Wyrtzen expects to extend the program to the television network.

MAIER HEARD IN FIFTY LANDS

"Bringing Christ to the Nations," international Lutheran Hour, has just announced the attainment of its fiftieth-country goal.

The addition of Station EAJ50 Las Palmas, Canary Islands, has raised to 50 the number of countries which now hear programs broadcast over 1100 stations in 20 languages.

"Our radio crusade for Christ proves that 'with God nothing shall be impossible," Dr. Walter A. Maier declared as the new station was added. "We started amid much misunderstanding and oppression, with two stations, one language and one country."

PROTEST POSTAL RATES

Congressional proposals to increase the second-class mailing rate have brought a storm of protest from Christian publishers.

Representatives of the religious press have testified before the Congressional committees that the proposed boost in rates will put many periodicals out of business.

Dr. Daniel Poling, editor of Christian Herald, declared the rate increases would increase the postage on his publication 400 per cent the first year and 700 per cent the second.

VATICAN DICKERS WITH ISRAEL

Negotiations are expected to get under way soon for diplomatic understanding between the Vatican and the new State of Israel.

The main purpose of this would be to draw up a treaty granting extra-territorial status to the Holy Places and ensuring Christian pilgrims free access to shrines in Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Nazareth, Gethsemane and elsewhere.

The Living Water

Have you boys and girls ever wondered what a wonderful thing water is? If all our food should suddenly disappear, we would grow thin, and become very, very hungry, but it would be quite a few days before we would die. But it would be a different story if all the water should be taken away from us. It would be only a short time until we would die. On a warm day, when we come home from school or play, all tired and hot and thirsty, it is really refreshing to enjoy a glass of cool water. Water then, means life.

I am going to tell you a story about Jesus after He had walked many, many miles with His disciples. I am sure He was tired, and perhaps thirsty too. The Bible tells us that He was "Wearied with His journey." Jesus and His disciples were traveling by foot from Judea to Gallilee. The Jews often made this journey, but they had to go through the land of the Samaritans. The Jews did not like

the Samaritans. In fact they hated them, and felt they were so much better than the Samaritans. The Jews would go a long, round about way to Gallilee from Judea, so they would not have to touch or see any of the Samaritans.

How different Jesus was! He did not go that round about way. He loved the Samaritans as much as He did the Jews, or any other people. In the book of John 4:4 we read, "And He must needs go through Samaria." It was a part of God's plan that the Samaritans should know and love Jesus.

As we told you a little bit ago, Jesus was weary and tired from that long, long walk that He and His disciples had made. As they neared the town of Sychar they saw a well. Jesus sat down on the well to rest. His disciples went into the city to buy food.

While Jesus was resting on this well a woman of Samaria came to draw water. Do you remember seeing pictures of women in Bible times carrying pitchers of water on their heads. There is only one account in the Bible of a man carrying water. This was the women's work. Jesus said to this woman, "Give me to drink." No doubt by His clothes the woman knew He was a Jew. It was very strange for a Jew to be in Samaria, but stranger yet for a Jew to ask a Samaritan to give him a drink.

"How is it that thou, being a Jew askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria?" she said. Then Jesus had the opportunity of talking to her about "Living Water." Jesus said unto her, "If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldst have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water."

Living water! The woman was interested. She wondered what Jesus meant. Jacob had dug this well, and where was this "living water" Jesus spoke of? Jacob had been a great man. "Art thou greater than our father Jacob?" she asked Him.

Then Jesus said to her, "Whosoever shall drink of this water shall thirst again." The woman knew that to be so, and could understand what He meant. Often she had drunk from this well that Jacob had dug, only to come back again and again thirsty and wanting more water. But that was not all. Jesus also said to her, "Whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall NEVER THIRST; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

The Samaritan woman did not quite understand what Jesus was talking about. One thing was sure however, she WANTED some of this living water. As Jesus continued to talk to her she knew He was the promised Saviour. And boys and girls, this LIVING WATER is salvation which we receive when we give our hearts to Jesus. Have you ever wondered why Christian people do not go to shows, or Sunday ball games, or many other places of amusement? It is because they have within them this "LIVING WELL," that thoroughly satisfies, and they never thirst for anything else other than what Jesus gives them.

The wonderful thing about all this is that this LIVING WATER is also for boys and girls. You too, can have something in your heart that really satisfies. I am sure that some of you who read this already know what I mean. So if you are a Christian, let us be very careful of where we go, the things we do and what we say. Here is a little motto we often see-"DO nothing that you would not like to be doing, when Jesus comes. SAY nothing you would not like to be saying when Jesus comes. GO to no place where you would not like to be found when Jesus comes.'

The only thing that can prevent God from using us is our own unsurrendered will.

This little-heralded but rapidly growing movement presents a challenge to Christians everywhere. Make your home an open house for God, and you may be surprised at the spiritual rewards that will come your way. Your home can have a real ministry among Christian youths and adults, and in reaching the unsaved, if you are willing to open it for God.

You say it would be extra work, take extra time, cause extra trouble. Perhaps. But if you don't try it, you will never know the joy that comes from opening your house to the Lord. An unlimited number of possibilities are open to you.

Perhaps you are saying that you don't have a beautifully furnished house, or the room in which to sponsor such activities, or the time to give them. The question is not what you have, but whether that which you do have is fully consecrated to the Lord.

Eternity alone will reveal what God can accomplish through His people in their homes. If your home is not being used to the fullest extent, now is the time to pray and to seek God's guidance as to how you can open it to service for Him.

What about the children on your street? Will you be winning them to Christ this summer? Will you be gathering them into your home for Bible study?

Orphanage Grows

The report from Sister Reuben Davis at the Orphanage in Madera, California, is as follows:

"The blessing of the Lord continues to be upon the work here. Souls are being saved in the regular services. There have been up to 50 saved in the last few months. Several have been miraculously healed. All glory belongs to God. Our Sunday School has reached 110 the last few Sundays. A few weeks ago we had a very precious baptismal service. Among those baptized were 5 of our children. It is encouraging to see the children grow in the Lord.

We have what we call 'story hour' every day and we would be happy to receive any kind of good literature to use to further the gospel. We also have children's church on Sundays at 6:30 p. m., and could also use material for this service.

A few weeks ago the Probation Officer sent us a family of six children deserted by their mother. The youngest is 2, oldest 14 years. The father wasn't able to care for them and they aren't eligible for Gounty aid so they brought them to us.

The dormitory and kitchen and dining hall will be ready soon and we feel our work will be much less strenuous then. Our quarters now are rather close. Before they are finished we will need 3 commodes. 3 lavatories, 1 tub, kitchen sink, larger cooking utensils, etc. We have a large electric stove (war surplus). A carpenter is making some tables now. We also need some kind of refrigeration for preservation of food. We have just completed fencing a large playground with non-climable fence, and hope to have some playground equipment. We are in quite a program but it is for God and we believe He is able.

We are in need of clothing, and can use most any size. We can use used clothing if it is good and sanitary. Each child has to have his own individual bed and that takes lots of sheets and bedding. The names and ages of the children are: Richard, 14 months; Kathleen, 2 years, 11 months; Carrol, 3 years, 11 months; Jane, 4 years; Judy, 5 years; Mary, 6 years; Yvonne, 7 years; Jerry, 8 years; Floyd, 9 years; Betty, 10 years; Vivian, 12 years; Shirley, 12 years; Corene, 14 years; Lovina, 15 years; Nora, 17 years.

We earnestly covet your prayers that God's smile of approval shall continue to rest upon this work."

Matthew 28:18, tells us Jesus said, "All power is given unto Me, in heaven and in earth," so we know He had the power to give it to whom He will, and in Matthew 10:1, "He called His 12 disciples and gave them power against unclean spirits to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease," and in Luke 10:19, he says, "Behold, I give you power to tread on serpents and scorpions and over ALL the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you." That promise was not alone to the disciples, but it is yours and mine today if we will live so we can appropriate it for ourselves. We are such a disappointment to God, when we call ourselves Christians and are powerless to help ourselves or free others who are bound by the devil. More people are bound by the devil today than were in Jesus time. All sickness comes from the devil. We read in Luke 13:10-20 of a woman who was paralized, and could in no wise lift herself up: Jesus said; Satan had bound her for 18 years, but Jesus healed her. When we read how He healed every kind of sickness and disease, leprosy, palsy, paralysis, lameness, blindness, fevers, everything of a diseased nature and raised the dead, and he says He is always the same, it should give us more faith. Perhaps you have been prayed for and were not healed; have you ever tried to find out why you were not healed? There is a reason. You may say it was because no one prayed the prayer of faith. That is just the reason; but there is also a reason why they could not pray that kind of a prayer. NO ONE can pray the prayer of faith for any person, if there is something between them and God. Are you sure you have done everything you promised God you would do, and done everything He told you to do? Is there anything of ill feeling in your heart toward anyone? Do you pay your tithes? Just take a look at

your own life; if you are sure you are clear before God and you still are not well it is possible you are letting the flesh judge for you. Perhaps the pain or swelling or symptoms are not all gone, so you decide you are not healed. Jesus said: "Blessed are they who have not seen (or felt) and yet have believed." You know the devil goes about as a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour, and he has no way of defeating you but to work on your senses of sight and feeling to make you doubt God has done the work and you are afraid to believe the work is done because it doesn't seem like it, you don't feel it. The devil is working much harder than he used to for he knows his time is short, and the children of God have harder testings than they used to have. Why does God permit us to be tortured by the devil? He says He will have a tried people. 1 Peter 1:7 says: "The trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ." If God always healed you instantly, where would your faith be tried? Sometimes the testing is prolonged and severe, to see if you will believe God in spite of seeming contradictions. If you listen to the devil and doubt, you lose your healing. I had had so many wonderful, instant healings through the years, it was a surprise to me when the folks prayed for my fractured limb and I wasn't healed. Every time anyone prayed I could feel the presence of God and expected it to be done. I went through such prolonged severe suffering that even my best friends tried to persuade me to go to the hospital for surgery, but I could not be pursuaded; like Job of old. I was determined to trust God though he slew me. I had been as faithful to God as I understood how and if He wanted me to die, I was willing and ready. If He was permitting the devil to try me as he tried Job, and it be-

came evident that He was. I decided to leave it in God's hands, the devil couldn't kill Job neither could be kill me. God gave me an assurance in Isaiah 48:10 "Behold I have refined thee, but not with silver: I have chosen thee in the furnace of affliction." I would not murmur or complain or advertise suffering to the world. I would just trust and wait His pleasure in restoring me, and I am so happy to know that I didn't fail God. So few people realize that we have to prove to God we can be trusted. We want to trust Him the limit of human need and we surely can IF HE can trust us. God's promises to us are sure, and He wants our promises to Him to be sure too. He will not suffer the devil to tempt us more than we are able to bear, but He must know He can depend on us. Job was what God called a perfect man and he was tried severely and the trial was prolonged it seems indefinitely, but eventually God healed him and his flesh came again as a child's. Suffering isn't a pleasant experience, but none of us have suffered as He did to redeem us. I had far rather suffer than to lose His smile. The devil cannot kill you until your work on earth is done, if you are trusting God. But when God calls back the lease He gave you on life, you will die that instant and all the doctors on earth cannot prolong your life one pulse beat, so why are you afraid to trust God?

If you have once trusted God for healing, and known the joy and freedom of His life imparted to your own, and then for any reason you have lost faith and gone back to medical aid, you have lost something of the greatest value, and never again will you have the same blessings or freedom in Him, never the same assurance, unless you can regain, by a new consecration, the same spiritual plane you stood on when you were completely surrendered to Him, body, soul and spirit. Don't try to put the blame on anyone else, He says He has placed before you an open door, and no man can shut it, for thou hast a little strength. We stand alone before God and He holds
