The goal of this course is to provide an understanding of leadership roles, concepts, and practices within a public safety communications environment. Ethical issues faced by public safety dispatchers will be examined and analyzed using contemporary ethical decision-making models. The course will employ interactive, learner-centered activities to cause students to think critically regarding ethical dilemmas, leadership opportunities, and the formulation defensible and professional response strategies to workplace and personal challenges. Students will leave the course with the skill and knowledge needed to enable ethical decision-making, along with the ability to surface strategies for personally exemplifying leadership within a public safety communications operation.
