

#### ICEBOAT RIGHT OF WAY & SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Below are a few definitions & Major sailing rules -- KNOW THEM AND USE THEM ALL!!

Note- The wind is always from the top to the bottom of this page,



Rule A- FAIR SAILING- Act in terms of COMMON SENSE, SAFETY, & GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP Rule B- RIGHT OF WAY- Yachts must KEEP CLEAR as follows;



# 2\* Off the wind: KEEP CLEAR



Off Wind keep clear on both PORT and STARTBOARD Tacts (DIFFERENT THAN WET SAILING)

## 3a. On the wind, Port Tack:










3b. Off the wind, Port Tack:





4b\* Off the wind, Same tack, Leeward yacht:






(DIFFERENT THAN WET SAILING)

Do not alter course so as to mislead or prevent a Non-Right of-Way yacht from keeping clear.



5b. Faster yacht, Same tack, From rear:







6. Tack or Jibe:

Do Not, if Collision is PROBABLE



#### Darling Mark

Darling Mark is a mark of the course to prevent starboard tack from forcing inside OVERLAP at the Leward Mark. (cannot go between Darling and Leward mark)

GREEN Flag Located 100 yds to windward from Leward Mark.

Now there may be Darling Mark at the windward Mark (DN Nationals)

#### Different from Wet Water Sailing


Rules 2, 4b, and 8 differ from Wet sailing

KEEP CLEAR 4b\* Off the wind, Same tack, Leeward yacht:











