



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**





15th Sunday Ordinary Year B

Two by two! Part of Jesus' mission instructions include the disciples being sent out in pairs. He initiates them into a spiritual buddy system There is security in numbers, yet, such pairings provide a great measure of accountability, too. Each disciple checks in and answers to another, that both can mutually uphold responsibilities. Think of this practice, similar to the support and accountability system between 'workout' partners at the gym or 'weight watcher' friends who check in with each other about exercise/diets and any habitual risks/temptations. I am familiar with certain monastic rules that dictate that whenever any monk leaves the monastery for business, they are to be accompanied by a brother.

Where did such a practice come from? We can sense the intuitive wisdom in such a protective arrangement for each other (like a wingman or shipmate in the military). But, we can find a scriptural precedent for such an 'evangelist-partner', with the practice of only 'accepting testimony' based on two witnesses. Jesus refers to such Old Testament practice in John 8:17, when He says, "Even in your own Law it is written that the testimony of two men is valid." Deuteronomy 19:15, had taught that, "One witness is not enough to convict anyone accused of any offense they may have committed. A matter must be established by the testimony of **two** or three witness." So, Jesus includes in His commands, such a wise practice of always having 'back-up' for any disciple on mission. When I hear Jesus send disciples out I also think of the scene of Noah's mission of repopulating the world with life as he marched animals off the ark into the world again 'two by two' as Genesis says, "just as God had commanded him" (Genesis 7:9). This brings us to the specific purpose and direction that Jesus commanded of them.

Mark 6:7 says that Jesus 'gave them authority over *unclean spirits*'. What specifically might 'unclean' mean? The simple answer to our modern Christian mind, would be 'sinful' spirits. To the Hebrew mind of Jesus' time, that would mean 'impure' spirits or 'unwashed'/'uncleansed' spirits. Yet we might ask the next best question which is "Well, list these spirits - what are they?" We can start with our inherited 'ten commandment' material and then look to how Jesus expands the application of the commandments more widely to daily practices (not every day am I tempted to murder, but I am tempted to anger much more frequently? Matt 5:22) So, I understand 'unclean spirits' to mean 'ungodly', or 'not focused on God's intention'. So, think of 'unclean spirits' as practically 'unexamined' spirits. Substitute the word 'unexamined' for 'unclean', and we might see how the spirits are cleansed by examination of them through the lens of God, using Jesus' eyes. 1 John 4:1 counsels such a ministry of discernment, when John writes "Do not trust every spirit but test the spirits to see whether they belong to God". Psalm 51:12, has Daivd praying for a 'cleansing' of spirits, when David says, "A clean heart create for me, God; renew within me a right spirit" (a right spirit is one in union or 'in sync' with God-as God intends.) It is a matter of 'examining' spirits! What 'spirit' do I possess? Is it 'of God'? If not, then it needs 'purifying' or 'cleansing'. Where does one start? Jeus offers a list to get started with, in Mark 7:21-22 "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly..." But we must keep in mind, that it is the 'examining' or 'washing' that Jesus wants initiated within us first. His presence (Holy Spirit) does that - As He dwells in us, then 'uncleanness' is cast out. We can witness an example of this in John 13:11 when Jesus discerns even among His own apostles, an uncleanness in Judas, saying "Not all of you are clean" (because Jesus sensed in John 13:2 "The devil had put into the heart of Judas...") So, the determination of 'unclean' is whether it is 'of Jesus' or not! I apologize that this meditation got technical after all, but basically Jesus was calling 'clean', all that is in accord with God's will. Such good would be pure, righteous, holy, 'washed' and in union with God's intended design. As Jesus' Beatitude said in Matthew 5:8 "Blessed are the *clean of heart*; for they will see God" and as He had taught in Mark 7:15 "Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile". So, look within the heart first, discern the spirit, and the resultant action will be known by its fruit (Matt 7:20). Peace. Fr Brian
