



Global March for Elephants and Rhinos - Burlington, Vermont

This year, on the first weekend in October, thousands of people around the world will march as one voice to put an end to the ivory and rhino horn trade. Unless action is taken now, we will lose these majestic, highly intelligent, and emotionally sentient creatures forever in just 5-10 years--- with lasting and far-reaching negative impacts on every level.

More than 35,000 elephants are being killed every year—that's one every 15 minutes—for their ivory and because of greed. A rhino is slaughtered once every 8 hours for its horn. Between 2010 and 2012 alone, poachers slaughtered more than 100,000 elephants (about a quarter of their entire population on earth). It is also estimated that 1,000 park rangers have been killed in the line of duty over the past 10 years, 75% by commercial poachers and armed militia groups.

Poaching has become killing on an industrialized scale and by the world's worst militia and terrorist groups. The \$1.4 billion ivory trade feeds crime syndicates. Political instability and corruption across Africa have made the enormous profits from the ivory black market a viable source for funding military resistance groups such as Al-Shabaab, Janjaweed, and Lord's Resistance Army.

Perhaps the most important fact you must know about this crisis is this: as long as there is value in ivory- no matter the age of the ivory—the killing will continue.

The US is second only to China in the blood ivory trade. And Vermonters say no more!

The goal of this exciting, kid-driven march is to create awareness surrounding the crisis and to show Vermonters what we must do to save the species. Citizens will be encouraged to contact their state representatives to ask them to support H.297, Vermont's ivory and rhino horn trade ban bill, without exemptions, in 2016. The only hope for survival of these species and the livelihoods of millions of people who depend on them for tourism lies in an immediate end to the ivory and rhino horn trade.

Join us as Burlington, Vermont and citizens of all ages from around the state unite and march against extinction on Sunday, October 4th, 2015.
