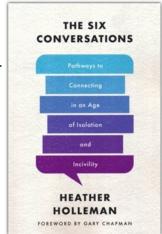

January 10th is the startup date for the new classes to begin:

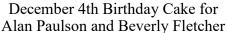
- 1:00 pm is the Classic class

Pumpkin Crunch Cake

- 1 large can evaporated milk
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 ½ cups sugar

Mix all together and put into 9 x 13 ungreased glass pan

1 Box Yellow Cake Mix

³/₄ cup melted margarine or butter

½ cup chopped walnuts

Sprinkle dry cake mix over top of pumpkin mix. Drizzle melted margarine or butter over dry cake mix.

Sprinkle nuts on top of butter.

Bake at 350° for 45 minutes.

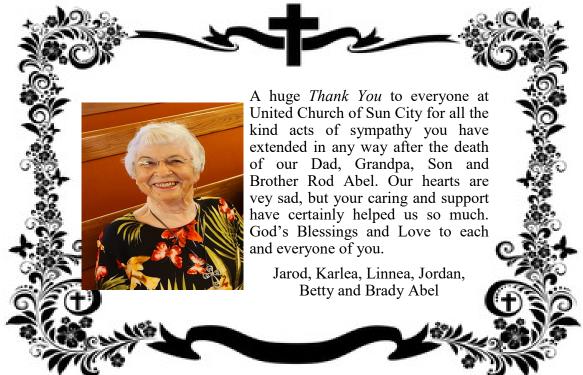
