As some of you know, I have been reticent about accepting this honor because I am a professional quilter with a computerized quilting system. Quilt Show Challenges

For those who are new to the quilt show, and as a reminder for the rest of us: You will hear updates for the challenges throughout the coming year.

I. The Quilt Show Challenge is a category of the show where participants purchase a brown bag that contains two pieces of fabric with instructions for creating a quilt. These quilts are entered into the show and are judged with prizes awarded. The bags are sold at the membership table, beginning early in the show year.

II. The Crayon Challenge is a fund raising category of the show. Participants are given an envelope with a crayon and instructions enclosed. These quilts are not entered into the show and judged, but are displayed for open bidding, with the proceeds going to a selected charity. The deadline for these little quilts is usually in July. 40 crayons are available at the membership table, starting with the February meeting of the show year.

October 29, 2018 at 7pm President Pat Henningfeld called the meeting to order.

Announcements:

The board will consider options, decide the best course of action, and report back to the guild.
