

#### February 3, 2019 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 4;21-30

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

What a 180 degree whiplash turn in the gospel today? It opens with Luke 4:22 "all spoke highly of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth." And it closes with Luke 4:28-9, "they were all filled with fury..... driving him out of town, leading him to the brow of the hill ......to hurl him down headlong." What a flip-flop in moods among the people! We will see another reversal like this in Holy week when it begins joyously with the crowds acclaiming Jesus with palms in the street saying "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" (Luke 19:38), and ends with the crowds shouting "Crucify Him, Crucify Him" (Luke 23:21).

What leads to such bipolar reversals? Why does the hometown of Jesus reject Him so hatefully? Why do they reject Him at all? Whether it is due to them feeling disappointed about Him not bringing popularity to their town's name, or because He asks too much of them by calling them to join His Mission, the root of their rejection amounts to their selfishness, thinking only of themselves. They wanted Jesus to advance them, putting them on the map and in the news. But, they weren't willing to join or work with Him to make it happen. They wanted all of the perks, but none of the pain of working in God's Mission Field. They are only in it for themselves. The minute that Jesus starts speaking of God blessing 'outsiders' like the Zarapheth widow or Naaman from Syria, they had, had enough. They only want God's blessing for themselves. Their selfish, racial prejudice blinds them to God's plan of salvation offered to everyone. In effect, they are saying, "What does Zarapheth deserve? Nothing! And who cares about Syria? What about us?" Turns out Nazareth will get on the map and in the news because of Jesus (remembered forever due to the sign above Jesus on cross 'INRI-Jesus Nazareth, King (Rex) of Jews'). But except for Mother Mary, Nazaretheans weren't standing with Jesus at the cross! They are why He is on it! Their rejection sets the pattern for everyone else to reject Him. Pope Benedict XVI wrote and spoke a lot about the shortage of 'witnesses' among Christians in our modern times. He pointed out the temptation to see our Christian faith as a 'rewards' card we carry around hidden in our wallets that we pull out to claim a benefit. Other than to claim rewards, we never bring it up. Benedict called it 'practical atheism' because it shows Christians simply blended into secular society, living just like everyone else, as if there was no Christian revelation. He uses the strong word 'atheism', because if Christianity does not have an effect or not provide anything new to how society operates, then it is just as if there is no God. If God is never mentioned, because it is inconvenient or costs more to mention Him, then that is 'practically atheism'! Pope Benedict reminds us that accepting Jesus' Way raises the standard of how we are to live; not for ourselves alone, but for the work of God and His mission of redeeming the world (His Audience Address Rome, 12/14, 2012).

Cinderella, a music group from the 1980's, had a popular song called, "You don't know what you got until its gone". Too often, that is what happens. We overlook blessings, taking God for granted, until we miss something. And, there is a temptation for our daily prayer to just turn into a 'wish-want-list' we submit to God. Instead of just asking and asking for our wants from God, I bet God appreciates when we simply check in with Him and 'Thank Him' for what we already have, taking note of our daily blessings! I am reminded of a boss who onetime said, "Why don't you call me sometime just to tell me how good things are going, because usually when I hear from you, it is after the bottom has fallen out?" Might God feel that way at times too, when we only show up to 'get' something from Him? No matter what, God loves to talk with His children. God always loves to visit with us in prayer, whether we are in need or not, but I can see the point of keeping our prayer focused on 'praise and thanks' first, and then moving on to what we feel about our own circumstances. After first praising and thanking God for 'what is', we can go on to share our worries and hearts' concerns about needs and worries. Certainly the model prayer, Jesus taught us, follows that pattern. The first lines of the Lord's Prayer address God above all, and praise his highest holiness and heavenly Kingdom, before coming around to later making the four personal requests from us, about daily bread, forgiveness, and the holy guidance and perseverance through temptations, distress and evil. But all our asking only comes after we praise and acknowledge His almighty will and goodness! That is our pattern to follow! We humbly place ourselves into God's will, and do not try to force God into our wills! God first! We follow!
