A Message from our Pastor **Allegra Hoots MD**IV

Give thanks in all circumstances; this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:18

Dear Friends.

Greetings to you in the holy and mighty name of our blessed Redeemer, the Lord Jesus Christ. As always, I trust God that all is well with you. I also hope you are experiencing the peace of Christ, relaxing in the joy of the Lord, and taking full advantage of the long daylight hours and hot weather to enjoy the outdoors.

As I meditated on the words of the Apostle Paul in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, urging us to give thanks in all circumstances, I thought about the recent heatwave that swept over Plainfield. Thermometers soared to 90 degrees, and the air hung heavy with humidity. In those sweltering moments, I grumbled about the moisture rather than appreciating the simple blessings around me—the pleasure and privilege of relaxing in a park beneath the shade of a large leafy tree or relaxing in my apartment cooled by central air conditioning.

This reflection transported me back to my youth when air conditioning was a luxury we didn't possess. Our family relied on electric fans or hand-held ones that funeral parlors used to give away. Or we purchased fancy-looking flimsy ones from G.C. Murphy's or McCrory's or made one out of a brown paper bag or newspaper. Those fans weren't effective. They did little to cool us down unless we held them close to our faces.

I also recalled seeking solace from the scorching sun by sipping ice-cold lemonade or Kool-Aid on a covered porch, under the shade of a tree, or in the shadow of a tall building. Homemade popsicles, frozen in metal ice cube trays, provided sweet relief. Those memories now stand as testaments to the resilience of the human spirit to adapt to nature.

In this retrospective pause, I whispered a prayer of gratitude. I asked God to forgive my complaints about the heat and humidity, realizing that modern technology—specifically, the invention of air-conditioning—has transformed our lives.

As we reflect on 1 Thessalonians 5:18, some of us will reminisce about simpler times. In contrast, others will celebrate the conveniences that make life more comfortable. For others, the passage will evoke thanks to God for deliverance from sin and ushering them into the marvelous light of salvation provided through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

May we embrace nostalgia and progress, recognizing that gratitude blooms even amidst heat waves. For in every season, whether sweltering or serene, like the words of Psalm 23, "He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters, and He refreshes and restores my soul," our hearts can find reasons to give thanks.

Glory to God.





Independence Day ~ July 4,th 2024



The Fourth of July—also known as Independence Day or July 4th—has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution.

On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 to the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.

<u>The Flag</u>

On August 21, 1959, President Eisenhower proclaimed Hawaii the 50th state of the Union and ordered a new arrangement for the stars on the flag – 5 rows with 6 stars and 4 rows with 5 stars. This new flag, the same one that we fly today, was first raised at Fort McHenry on July 4, 1960. Recall that this is the place where Francis Scott Key was inspired to write "The Star Spangled Banner" during the War of 1812.

Eagle

Eagles have long been a symbol of power and strength. In ancient Rome, eagle imagery was particularly prominent, and the Founding Fathers were known to compare their new republic to the old Roman Republic. Thus it came as no surprise when Congress adopted a design for its national seal, or coat of arms, which prominently featured an eagle.

Liberty Bell

The bell was originally ordered by the Pennsylvania Assembly in 1751 to commemorate the 50-year anniversary of William Penn's 1701 Charter of Privileges (Pennsylvania's original Constitution). The Charter speaks of the rights and freedoms of common people. Penn's ideas on religious freedom, Native American rights, and the inclusion of citizens in enacting laws were quite unique for his time.

Statue of Liberty

The statue is a figure of Libertas, the Roman goddess of liberty. She holds a torch above her head with her right hand, and in her left hand carries a tabula ansata inscribed JULY IV MDCCLXXVI (July 4, 1776, in Roman numerals), the date of the U.S. Declaration of Independence. A broken chain and shackle lie at her feet as she walks forward, commemorating the national abolition of slavery following the American Civil War. After its dedication the statue became an icon of freedom and of the United States, being subsequently seen as a symbol of welcome to immigrants arriving by sea.

Fireworks:

The first fireworks were used as early as 200 BC. The tradition of setting off fireworks on the 4 of July began in Philadelphia on July 4, 1777, during the first organized celebration of Independence Day.

 \Rightarrow <u>Rally Day</u> - September 15th: First day of classes for all ages for the new year.

If you were baptized as children or infants, it is our parents who initially accept the vows on our behalf. Confirmation then becomes our opportunity to personally reaffirm those baptismal vows and claim the grace offered by Christ in baptism. Confirmation is a reaffirmation of our baptismal vows.







CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger

Jesus Is Rejected in Nazareth

Theme: Jesus was rejected in His own hometown.

Object: None

Scripture: Mark 6:1-13

Do you feel welcome when you come to church?



(Pause.) I hope so! I hope you have some friends here who you love to play with. Now let me ask you another question: If Jesus were to walk in today, do you think He would feel welcome? Explain why you think that.

The Bible tells about a time Jesus went to the synagogue, which is like a church, in His hometown. It says before Jesus returned to His hometown, He had healed many people and even raised a young girl from the dead. As He always did, on the weekly day of rest, called the Sabbath, Jesus went to the synagogue. He began teaching, and many who were there were amazed at what they heard. They didn't know that Jesus had so much wisdom and power. But He wasn't welcomed by everyone. What do you think about Jesus not being welcomed in His own hometown? (Pause for answers.)

The Bible says some of the people in the synagogue began to make fun of Jesus. "Who does He think He is? And where does He get this wisdom and the power to do miracles? Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't He the son of Mary and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas, and Simon? Don't His sisters live right here in the same town with us?" They were offended by the teachings of Jesus and refused to believe in Him.

(Invite children to close their eyes now. Have them think of a time they were rejected. Encourage them to consider how they felt and how they reacted. Allow about a minute, and then have kids open their eyes. Invite children to share about any feelings they had.)

Jesus responded to those who rejected Him by saying, "A prophet is not accepted in His own hometown, among His relatives, on the streets He played in as a child." Because of their unbelief, Jesus was unable to do any miracles among them except to place His hands upon a few people and heal them. Jesus was amazed at their unbelief.

(Encourage kids to think about Jesus' experience in the synagogue that day. Invite them to show their reaction without saying any words; only with their face and bodies.)

Jesus told His disciples to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). But just as many in Nazareth rejected Jesus, they would also reject His disciples. If you and I tell others about Jesus, they might reject us too. They might say, "Who do they think you are? You're just kids." Jesus told us to tell others about Him, but He said it would not be easy.

PRAYER:

God, just as Jesus was rejected in His own hometown, we may also be rejected when we tell others about Jesus. Help us remain Jesus' faithful witnesses even when it isn't easy. In Jesus' name, amen.


