Summertime 2020 for Pets-

This summer is predicted to be a very hot one! Pets react differently to extremely hot temperatures, they are affected more quickly and can suffer heatstroke rapidly as well. There are several things to do that will help, the obvious being making sure that shelter and fresh water are always available. If it's going to be a hot day, leave your pet at home rather than exposing them to the heat a car can generate. Consider a kiddie pool for water dogs. Walk them early while it's still relatively cool outside. If your pet suffers at night from heat, there are now pet beds available that offer cooling, as well as orthopedic features. For dogs who are active and need a walk even during high temps, there are cooling vests and jackets available too. Always watch for signs of heatstroke, excessive panting, drooling, lethargy, seizures and collapse.
