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#### INTRODUCTION

Priority health risk behaviors (i.e. preventable behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of morbidity and mortality) are often established during childhood and adolescence and extend into adulthood. Ongoing surveillance of youth risk behaviors is critical for the design, implementation, and evaluation of public health interventions to improve adolescent health. The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) is a national surveillance system that was established in 1991 by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor the prevalence of health risk behaviors among youth. YRBS data are routinely collected on high school students, but only a few states collect data on middle school students. In 2015 the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health contracted with the University of Nevada, Reno, School of Community Health Sciences to conduct the YRBS in *all* middle schools throughout the state (117 schools).

The Nevada Middle School YRBS is an anonymous and voluntary survey of students in 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade in regular public, charter, and alternative schools. The survey asks students to self-report their behaviors in five major areas of health that directly lead to morbidity and mortality, these include:

- 1) Behaviors that contribute to unintentional injuries and violence;
- 2) Tobacco use:
- 3) Alcohol and other drug use;
- 4) Unhealthy dietary behaviors; and
- 5) Physical inactivity.

The 2015 Nevada Middle School YRBS provides statewide data to assess priority health-risk behaviors among middle school students; measure progress toward achieving national health objectives for *Healthy People 2020* and other program and policy indicators; and evaluate the impact of broad school and community interventions at the national, state, and local level. It is our intention that these data will be used by education and health professionals, policy makers, community members, and researchers to improve the health of Nevada's middle school students.

#### **METHODS**

#### Sampling, Weighting, and Analysis

The 2015 Nevada YRBS sampling plan was designed to ensure that every eligible student had an equal chance of selection. A two-stage (region and classroom) cluster sample design to produce a representative sample of students in grades 6-8 (all Nevada regular public, charter, and alternative middle schools). In order to provide regional data that represent all counties in the state, the first sampling stage grouped all 17 school districts into 7 regions that generally reflect the prevention coalition structure (Table 1). The regional grouping also helped ensure that individual schools could not be identified. In the second sampling stage, classes were selected within schools with the probability based on a required margin of error in the sample size for each region. Intact classes of either all second period or all required English courses were randomly

selected from each school. The questionnaire was administered to all students in sampled classes from February to May, 2015.

The 2015 Nevada YRBS data were weighted at the state level and regional level based on the sex, race/ethnicity, and grade level of students in each region. The weighting process ensured that the estimates accurately represent the entire student population in each region and the state as a whole. Non-response or poor sampling procedures can result in a sample that is not a representative subset of the population; therefore unweighted results from these samples may not accurately reflect student behaviors and could be misleading. This report only displays weighted results.

# **Permission Status and Response Rates**


Parental permission is required for YRBS participation. Nevada school districts have two forms of parental permission: 1) active and 2) passive. *Active parental permission* means the students must return a signed permission form indicating their parent or guardian's approval for participation in the survey. *Passive parental permission* means the students take a permission form home and return it only if their parent or guardian does not want them to participate in the survey. The type of permission status varies by district based on school district policy. Active permission requires more time and resources and may reduce the number of students that participate in the survey. All school districts agreed to participate in the 2015 Middle School YRBS and only 4 schools did not participate (95 potential respondents). Overall, 4,535 youth from 113 schools completed the survey. While the overall response rates (a combination of

school and student participation) varied by school district, response rates were higher in the school districts with passive parental permission (Table 2 and Figure 1).

#### **SUMMARY HIGHLIGHTS**

\*Please note: The YRBS *middle school* survey uses different questions and response time periods than the *high school* survey. Very few questions can be directly compared.

#### Safety

- 75.4% of middle school students rarely or never wore a helmet while riding a bicycle.
- 79.7% of middle school students rarely or never wore a helmet while rollerblading or skateboarding.
- 22.5% of middle school students rode in a car or other vehicle driven by someone who had been drinking alcohol during the past 30 days.

#### **Violence-Related Behaviors**

- 43.2% of middle school students were ever in a physical fight.
- 9.1% of middle school students were in a physical fight on school property during the past 12 months.
- 5.7% of middle school students were a member of a gang during the past 12 months.
- 44.7% of middle school students were ever bullied on school property.
- 23.7% of middle school students were ever electronically bullied.
- 14.1% of middle school students did not go to school because they felt unsafe at school or on their way to or from school during the past 30 days.
- 13.3% of middle school students never or rarely felt safe and secure at school.

#### **Emotional Health**

- 31.4% of middle school students ever felt sad or hopeless almost every day for two or more weeks in a row.
- 22.9% of middle school students ever seriously considered killing themselves.
- 13.4% of middle school students ever made a plan about how to kill themselves.
- 8.7% of middle school students ever tried killing themselves.
- 20.2% of middle school students ever did something to purposely hurt themselves without wanting to die.

#### **Tobacco Use**

- 14.4% of middle school students ever tried cigarette smoking.
- 2.4% of middle school students smoked cigarettes during the past 30 days.
- 2.0% of middle school students used smokeless tobacco during the past 30 days.

#### **Electronic Vapor Product Use**

- 26.7% of middle school students ever used electronic vapor products.
- 11.3% of middle school students used electronic vapor products during the past 30 days.

#### **Alcohol Use**

- 29.4% of middle school students ever had a drink of alcohol.
- 10.3% of middle school student drank alcohol during the past 30 days.
- 2.6% of middle school students participated in binge drinking during the past 30 days.

#### **Marijuana and Other Drugs**

- 10.2% of middle school students ever used marijuana.
- 4.0% of middle school students ever used synthetic marijuana.
- 4.2% of middle school students ever took prescription drugs without a doctor's prescription.
- 2.3% of middle school students ever used cocaine.
- 6.5% of middle school students ever used inhalants.
- 1.7% of middle school students ever used methamphetamines.

#### Diet

- 14.4% of middle school students did not eat breakfast during the past 7 days.
- 5.4% of middle school students most of the time or always go hungry because there is not enough food in their house and 11.2% sometimes go hungry because there is not enough food in the house.

#### **Physical Activity**

- 12.3% of middle school students did not participate in at least 60 of physical activity on any day during the past 7 days.
- 27.7% of middle school students watched three or more hours of television per day on an average school day.
- 41.0% of middle school students played video or computer games or used a computer for three or more hours per day on an average school day.
- 58.4% of middle school students attend physical education (PE) classes on one or more days in an average week when they were in school.
- 42.4% of middle school students did not get at least 8 hours of sleep on an average school night.

#### Weight

- 27.3% of middle school students describe themselves as slightly or very overweight.
- 46.2% of middle school students were trying to lose weight.

#### Resilience

- 65.3% of middle school students had parents or other adults who most of the time/always asked where they were going or who they were with.
- 48.1% of middle school students had parents or other adults that ever talked to them about what they expect them to do or not to do when it comes to sex.
