Citizens give input on Bedford Comprehensive Plan update

BEDFORD — Bedford residents and those who work in Bedford offered their input during a five-day community design workshop comprised of focus groups, stakeholder interviews, surveys and interactive meetings during the Limestone Festival, June 27-July 1.

The event was capped with a public open house at StoneGate Arts & Education Center July 1.

According to Katy Shackleford of Lochmueller Group, who guided the study, "Bedford's Comprehensive and Downtown Plan Update will guide future growth and development for the next 20 years and provide the framework for securing state and federal funding for community projects. As a result of the previous plan, Bedford achieved Stellar Community designation in 2013," Shackleford said.

"To date, the 2013 Stellar Community projects have brought more than \$27 million of investment to downtown Bedford and resulted in projects including the Stonecutters Place Senior Apartments, StoneGate Arts & Education Center, and the Downtown Depot relocation," she said.
